3. Miss the boat:- to miss an opportunity. (अवसर गंवाना)



12. A dime a dozen: Very common and of no particular value. (एकदम साधारण व सस्ता)

13. Beat about the bush:- To avoid getting to the point of an issue. (घुमा फिर के बातें करना)






Eg:- Spring is the time when the government primes the pump to help farmers prepare their fields.

## 16. To walk on the air:- to feel extremely excited or happy (बहुत खुश होना)



# 18. By the skin of your teeth:- Just barely/ by a very narrow margin; only just. (मुश्किल से)




### **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**

19. Through thick and thin:- under all circumstances, no matter how difficult. (किसी भी हालत में)

20. Blessing in disguise:- Something that seems bad or unlucky at first but causes something good to happen later: (दु:ख के भेष में सुख)



Eg:- Being laid off was a blessing in disguise — within a month I got a much better job.

# 21. To be in two minds:- To be uncertain (असमंजस की स्तिथि में होना/निश्चय नहीं कर पाना)

Eg:- I was of two minds about whether or not to come this morning.

22. Fall foul of:- to get into trouble because of failing to do what is required by (the law, a rule, etc.) (समस्या में पड़ना)





23. Gift of the gab:- the ability to speak with eloquence and fluency. (बोलने की कुशलता)



# Q24. Get into a scrape:- Involved in a problem (किसी समस्या में पड़ना)



# 27. To go to the dogs :- To become worse. (बदतर हो जाना)

28. Up the creek :- In trouble, in a serious predicament. बहुत गंभीर समस्या में पड़ना..

## 29. Back to the drawing board:- to plan it all over again (नये सिरे से शुरुवात)

Eg- The government must go back to the drawing board and whole issue of youth training.

30. Jumped the gun:- to do something too soon, especially without thinking carefully about it: (बिना सोचे समझे जल्दीबाजी में कोई काम कूरना) sir English



Ex -They've only just met - isn't it jumping the gun to be talking about marriage already?

31. Be on the ball:- to be quick to understand and react to things./ be alert to new ideas, methods, and trends. (सतर्क रहना)



Eg:- She really is on the ball; she's bought houses at auctions so she knows what she's doing.

32. Stir up a hornets' nest:- To make trouble, cause a commotion (समस्या पैदा करना)

Eg:- According to my brother Pankaj, She was asking a lot of questions and stirring up a hornet's nest around town.

## 33. Face the music :- Get reprimanded / be punished (डाट खाना)

Eg – The children broke the pane while playing and had to face the music for doing so.

# 34. To rain cats and dogs:- raining very heavily (बहुत तेज़ बारिश होना)




### **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**

35. To take a bull by the horns:- To deal with a difficult situation in a very direct or confident way (किसी कठिन परिस्थित से आत्मविश्वास से निपटना)

### 36. Call it a day:- stop working (काम करना बंद करना)

38. Under the cloud:- Viewed with suspicion, distrust, or disapproval. (संदेह के घेरे में होना)

Eg:- The driver was under suspicion after the police found blood on his car.

# 39. A perfect storm:- The worst possible situation (सबसे ख़राब स्थिति)

Eg:- The past two years have been a perfect storm for the travel industry.

# 40. Bad blood:- Enmity/angry feeling (आपसी दुश्मनी)

Eg - There has been bad blood between the two families for years.

41. As dead as a doornail:- completely obsolete/ Totally or assuredly dead (पूरी तरह से अप्रचलित/मरा




#### **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**

43. Cut corners:- to do something in the easiest, cheapest, or fastest way:(कन्नी काटना)

Eg:- It is certainly not a sensible to cut corners on your children's education."

44. Hit the jackpot:- to win the largest prize in a competition or game./ to achieve great success. (भाग खुलना)



Eg;- We're going to hit the jackpot with the new software we've developed.

45. True colours :- true personality./ the kind of person someone really is rather than what the person seems to be: (सच्चा व्यक्तित्व)

Eg:- I thought he was a really sweet guy, but then he got mad and showed his true colors.

46. Bird's eye view :- the ability to look at something from a very high place so that you see a large area below you: (सरसरी नज़र से देखना) AMAN SIR ENGLISH



Ex:- From the top of this building, you can get a bird's-eye view of the city.

# 47. Take something with a grain of salt:- to

understand that something is likely to be untrue or incorrect. (किसी भी चीज को संदेह के साथ स्वीकार



Ex- You have to take everything she says with a grain of salt, because she tends to exaggerate.

48. Get up on the wrong side of the bed: start the day in a bad mood, which continues all day long. (दिन की शुरुआत ख़राब होना)

Eg – My father got up on the wrong side of bed, and he's been grumpy on me all day.

49. Speak one's mind: to say what you think about something very directly: (अपने मन की बात कहता है)



51. Chew the cud: to think slowly and carefully about something: (सीच विचार करना)

# 52. Apple pie order:- In perfect order (एकदम ठीक हालत में)

Eg - They found everything in apple-pie order.

53. Pipe dream:- an idea or plan that is impossible or very unlikely to happen: (एक ऐसा सपना जो कभी पूरा नहीं हो सकता)

Eg:- Her plans are not realistic - they'll never be more than a pipe dream.

# 54. At cross purposes:- Disagreeing with each other's ideas (एक दूसरे के विचारों से असहमत होना)


#### **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**



Eg:- It became clear that they were talking at cross-purposes.

55. Play/Do something by the ear:- to decide what to do when you know what is happening, rather than planning in advance: (किसी परिस्तिथ में उसी के अनुसार



Ex- We can't make a decision yet. Let's just play it by ear.

56. You snooze, you lose:- If you are not alert, you are likely to miss opportunities. (सतर्कता के अभाव में अवसर गंवाना)



# 57. Out of the blue:- Unexpectedly (अप्रत्याशित रूप से)




#### **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**

Eg:- He's skating on thin ice by lying to the police.

# 59. No smoke without fire/where there's smoke there's

fire:- there is always some truth behind a rumour or bad thing. (बिना आग के धुआं नहीं होता/कोई भी चीज़ बिना कारण नहीं होती)



Ex- She says the accusations are not true, but there's no smoke without fire.

Eg:- He'll be in the soup when the truth comes out.

61. Familiarity breeds contempt:- used to say that if you know someone very well you stop respecting them because you have seen all of their bad qualities. (जितना ज्यादा हम किसी को जानने लगते है, उतनी ही उसमें कमियां नजर आने



Eg;- After working in the same company with her for so many years he hates even her name, just because familiarity breeds contempt.

62. To throw/pour cold water on :- To criticize someone's opinions or ideas and stop people believing them or being excited about them. क्रांकिवादिवादकर्मी



Ex- Her parents threw cold water on her dream of becoming a poet.

63. First and foremost:- most importantly; more than anything else. (सबसे महत्वपूर्ण)

Ex- In spite of being elected to office, she remains first and foremost a writer.

64. A hard nut to crack :- a problem that is difficult to solve (कठिन समस्या)

65. Dance attendance:- to do everything that someone asks you to and treat them in a special way: (सेवा में तेयार रहना)



Ex- I can't stand the way he has to have someone dancing attendance on him the whole time.
