**Antonyms:-** Apathetic, Indifferent

**2.Feeble:-** With no energy or power, Weak (शक्तिहीन, दुर्बल)

**Mnemonics:-** Weak and thin like a needle.

**Synonyms:-** Puny, Wasted, Frail

**Antonyms:-** Hearty, Strong, Effective

**Eg.:-** The Giant has become very old and feeble.

**3.Hostile:-** Having very strong feelings against somebody/something (व्यक्ति या वस्तु के प्रति अत्यंत उग्र भावना; प्रतिकूल भाव)

**Mnemonics:-** Hostlers day scholars के प्रति hostile होते हैं

**Synonyms:-** Antagonistic, Confrontational, Belligerent, Hostile, Unfriendly, Inimical, Adversarial, Oppositional, Combative, Rivalrous, Feuding, Favourable

**Eg.:-** The West has gradually relaxed its hostile attitude to this influential state.





**4.Insidious:-** Something unpleasant or Dangerous, Something gradually and secretly causing harm (कपटी)

**Mnemonics:-** Inside us रहते हैं और हमारे लिए insidious बन जाते हैं

**Synonyms:-** Harmful, Stealthy, Subtle

**Antonyms:-** Beneficial, Harmless

**Eg.:-** The early signs and symptoms of thyroid deficiency are insidious and subtle.

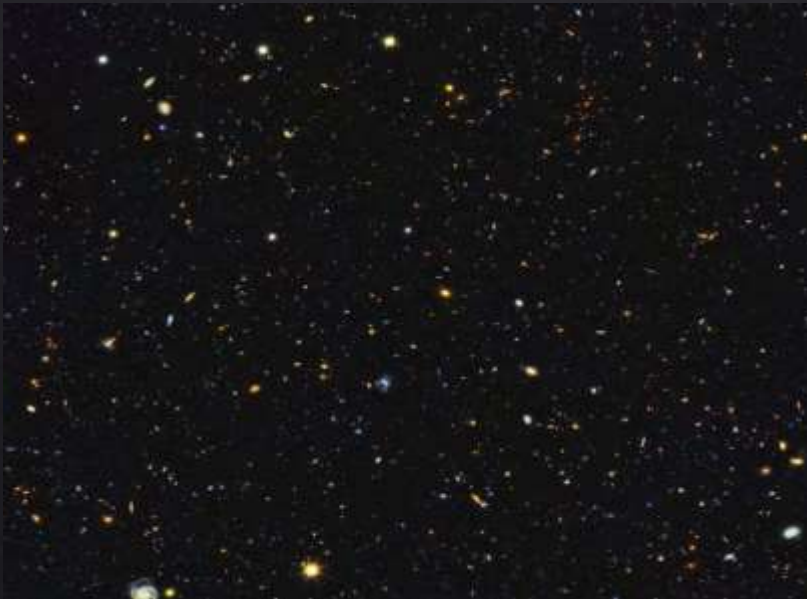
**5.Abound:-** To exist in large numbers (प्रचुर मात्रा में)

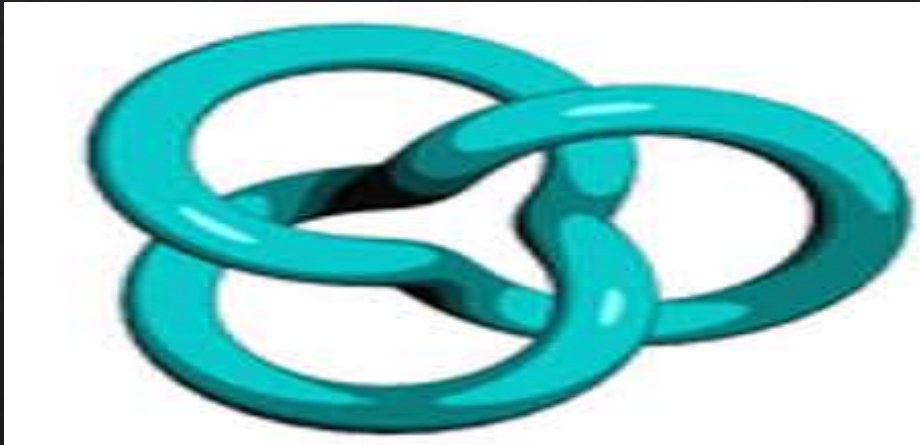

**Antonyms:-** Separated, Disjointed, Uncoupled, Disunited



**Eg.:-** The circuits are interlinked with each other and the main power supply.



**11.Cautious:-** Someone who is cautious avoids risks (सावधान)

**Mnemonics:-** Pre + caution

**Synonyms:-** Circumspect, Considerate, Guarded

**Antonyms:-** Incautious, Reckless, Careless

**Eg.:-** The burglar was very cautious, so he avoided the security perfectly as they didn't find any proof.

**12.Intriguing:-** to make somebody very interested and wanting to know more (दिलचस्प)

**Eg.:-** He became verbose after a few drinks.

**15. Consequence:-** A result of a particular action or situation, often one that is bad or not convenient (परिणाम)

**Synonyms:-** Outcome, Upshot, Sequel

**Antonyms:-** Cause, Inception, Origin

**16.Unbiased:-** Able to judge fairly (निष्पक्ष)

**Eg.:-** They give unbiased advice as they want the best for us.

**17.Utilitarian:-** Designed to be useful rather than decorative (उपयोगी)

**Antonyms:-** Impractical, Unnecessary

**Eg.-** The government's utilitarian stance was appreciated by all.

**18.Inevitable:-** Certain to happen; Unavoidable (जिसे टाला जा सके)

**Synonyms:-** Unpreventable, Assured, Certain

**Antonyms:-** Avoidable, Distant, Unsure

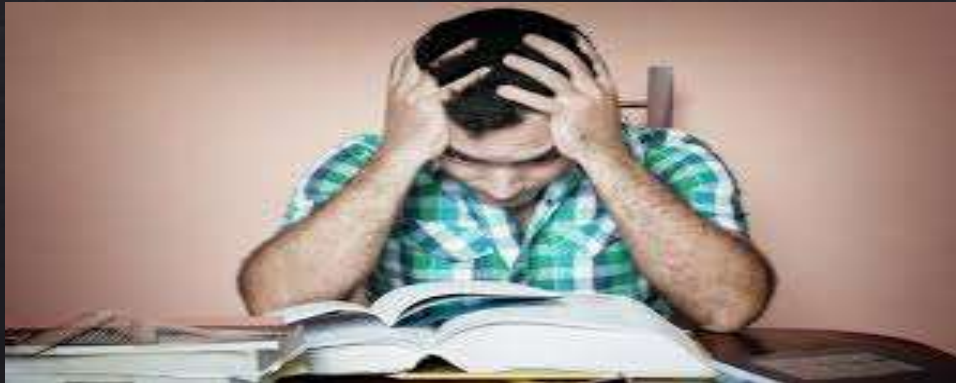
**19.Degradation:-** The situation in which people are made to feel they have no value (गिरावट)

**23.Incredible:-** Impossible, or very difficult to believe,Extremely good  
(अविश्वनीय)

**Root word:-** In (not) + Cred (believe) + able

**Synonyms:-** Unbelievable, Implausible, Improbable

**Antonyms:-** Reasonable, Credible, Plausible

**Eg.:-** In an incredible act of kindness, a stranger off the street offered to donate a kidney for the ill teenager.

**24.Vendetta:-** A long and violent argument between people or families (पुश्तैनी झगडा)

**Mnemonics :-** जो हमें चैन से नहीं जीने देता उसके साथ हम करते हैं vendetta.

**Synonyms:-** Bickering, Grudge, Hostility, Quarrel, Rivalry

**Antonyms:-** Forgiveness, Calm, Harmony

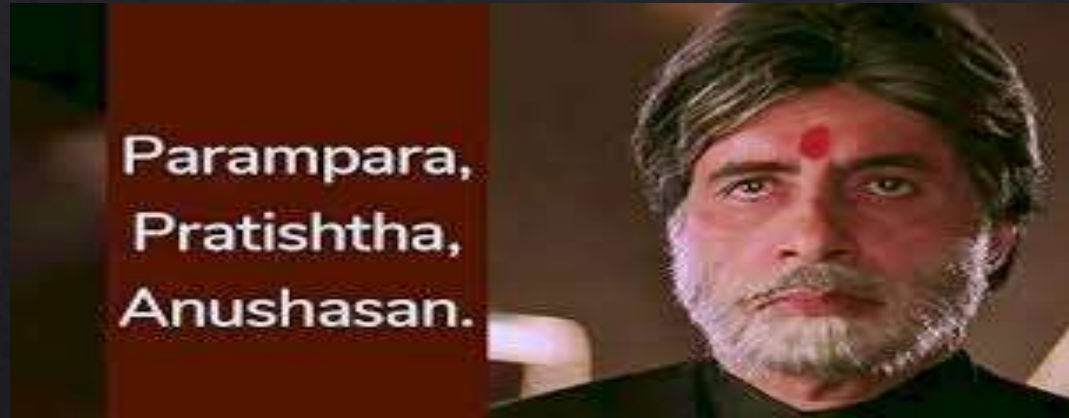
**25.Adamant:-** Determined in character, action, or ideas (दृढ़ निश्चयी)

**Antonyms:-** Shyness, Bashfulness, Cowardice, Hesitation

**31.Vulnerable:-** Able to be easily physically or Mentally hurt, Influenced, or Attacked (असुरक्षित/कमोजर)

**Antonyms:-** Invulnerable, Shielded, Immune

**Eg.:-** The financial sector could be vulnerable in a prolonged economic slump.

**32.Immerse:-** To put something or someone completely under the surface of a liquid (डुबाना)

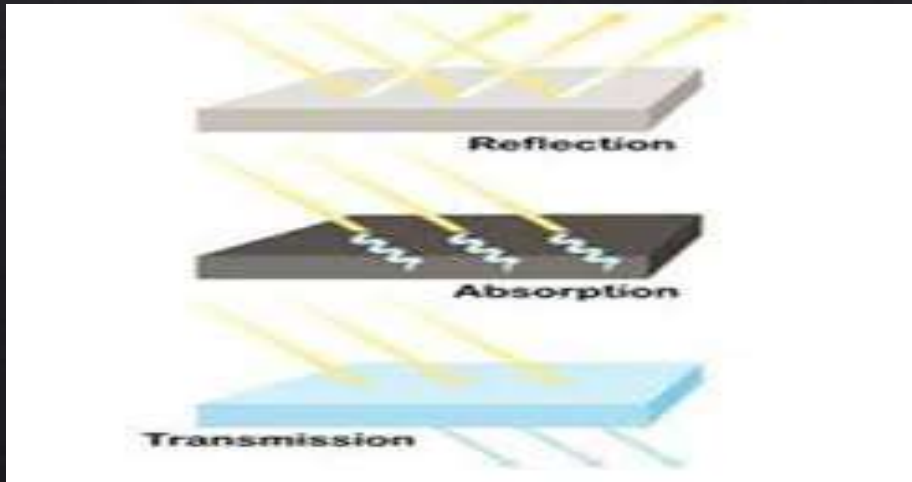

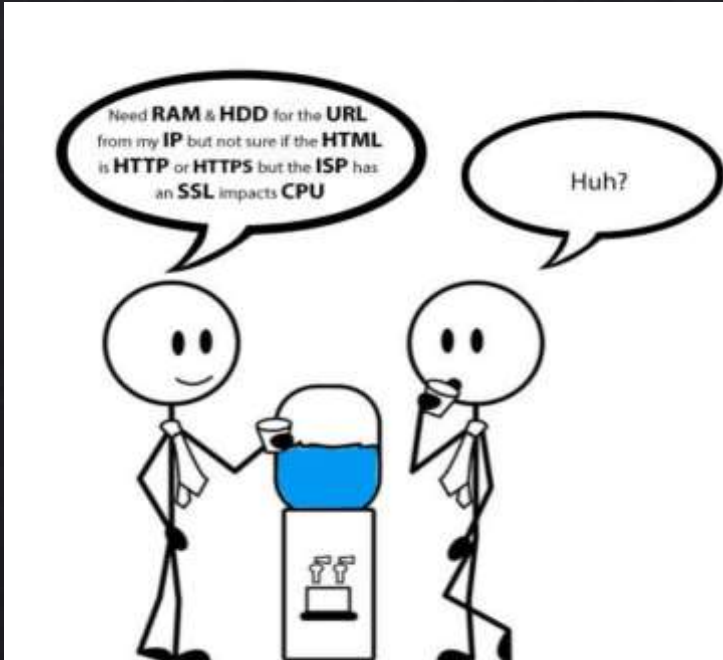

**42.Transgression:-** an action that breaks a law or rule उल्लंघन

**Antonyms:-** obedience, virtue, perfection, goodness, etc.
