Servile:- too eager to praise or obey someone चापलूस

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- servant जैसा attitude

Synonyms: - obsequious, sycophantic, subservient, ingratiating, Etc.

Antonyms:- aggressive, dominant, etc.



E.g.:- He is so servile that other people take advantage of him.

Optimistic:- hoping for believing that good things will happen in the future आशावादी

Mnemonics :- opportunity आयेगी मस्त

Synonyms: - assured, bright, buoyant, cheerful, confident, Etc.

Antonyms:- dejected, gloomy, pessimistic, sorrowful etc.



E.g.:- Rajni is optimistic and hopes for the best even when things look bleak.

Adage:- a wise saying or proverb: लोकोक्ति

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- Adage (old age), old age के लोग बहुत adage use करते है

Synonyms: - axiom, maxim, precept, apothegm, byword Etc Antonyms: - absurdity, ambiguity, foolishness, paradox, etc.



E.g.:- He gets tired of all the same old sayings, so he is always trying to come up with a new adage.



E.g.:- Because the judge was upset about Rita's callous disregard for others, he sentenced her to ten years for drunk driving english


Curtail:- to reduce or limit something कम करना

Mnemonics: - stay with you in uncha or nicha situation

Synonyms: - ardent, loyal, reliable, stalwart, steadfast, Etc

Antonyms: - disloyal, flexible, indefinite, insecure, loose, etc.



E.g.:- Since the two countries are staunch allies it is not surprising they will work together in the war to defeat their shared enemy.

Wicked:- morally wrong and bad दुष्ट/ शैतान

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- वो wicked है wicket उठा के मार देता है
Synonyms: - devilish, evil, impish, mischievous, wayward Etc
Antonyms:- moral, nice, obedient, useful, worthwhile, etc.



E.g.:- Because he had no morals, the wicked man went around trying to hurt everyone he met.



Antonyms:- astute, discerning, perceptive, suspicious, etc.



E.g.:- Unfortunately, the elderly woman was gullible enough to provide the con man with all of her financial information. SIR ENGLISH

Lucid:- clear and easy to understand समझने में आसान

Mnemonics: - as clear as this liquid

Synonyms: - luminous, unambiguous, apprehensible, etc

Antonyms:- gloomy, vague, shadowy, obscure, murky, etc.



E.g.:- The directions for assembling the complex table were not very lucid.

Patriot:- a person who loves their country and, if necessary, will fight for it देश-भक्त

Mnemonics :- इतना पीटने के बाद भी ratt लगा रखी है कुछ नहीं बताऊँगा

Synonyms: - loyalist, nationalist, patrioteer, statesperson, etc.

atriate, traitor, rebel, etc.

E.g.:- Without thinking twice, the patriot gathered up his weapons and sought out after the terrorists.





Mnemonics :- अबे तुमसे नहीं होगा तुम obstuse हो

Synonyms: - stupid, dull, unintelligent, lumpish, etc.

Antonyms:- bright, intelligent, pointed, quick, sharp, smart, etc.



E.g.:- Are you so obtuse that you will give away all your money to a fake charity?

Notion:- something that you have in your mind; an idea धारणा, विचार

Mnemonics: - according to my notion this is the correct option Synonyms: - approach, assumption, perception, sentiment, etc.

E.g.:- When the girl saw how much her friends liked her sugar cookies, she had the notion to open an online bakery.

Synonyms: - hermit, anchorite, ascetic, cenobite, monk, etc.

Antonyms:- extrovert, socialite, mixer, extrovert, etc.



E.g.:- Despite her reputation as a recluse, Samantha held regular gatherings in her home to entertain close friends.

E.g.:- The married couple is currently in a state of divergence, going through the divorce process so they can legally separate.

Synonyms: - condition, predicament, quandary, trouble, etc.

Antonyms:- advantage, benefit, boon, good fortune, blessing etc.



E.g.:- My problems aren't much compared with the plight of the storm victims.

Synonyms: - budding, flourishing, blossoming, sprouting, etc.

Antonyms:- barren, declining, fading, sterile, unfruitful, etc.



E.g.:- The flowers were mere buds for most of the year, but now that they have enough sunlight, they are blooming.

Synonyms: - elemental, inborn, ingrained, inherent, essential, etc.





Antonyms:- essential, major, necessary, pertinent, relevant, etc.



E.g.:- Someone needs to tell Anamika that no human being is trivial, and she should be nicer to the people that work under her.



Mnemonics:- in + courage

Synonyms: - optimistic, roused, fearless, enthusiastic, etc.



Antonyms: discouraged disheartened, dispirited, etc.

E.g.:- A recruiter went to the school and encouraged students to join the military instead of going straight to work after graduation.

Homicidal:- characterized by or likely to commit murder हिंसक

Mnemonics:-homi (human) + cide (kill)

Synonyms: - brutal, cruel, fierce, violent, passionate, etc.

Antonyms:- calm, impotent, tame, pleasant, mild, etc.



E.g.:- Homicidal thoughts caused the deranged woman to plot a way to kill her estranged husband.

Sluggish:- slow-moving and lacking in energy आलंसी

Mnemonics :- slow + leg

Synonyms: - lethargic, listless, slack, stagnant, apathetic etc.

Antonyms:- alert, energetic, lively, moving, spirited, etc.



E.g.:- A heavy lunch makes me sluggish in the afternoon.

Evident:- easily seen or understood: प्रत्यक्ष, स्पष्ट
