Acquitted:- to decide officially in a law court that someone is not guilty of a particular crime: अपराधमुक्त AMAN SIR ENGLISH Mnemonics:- अब उसकी jail में कुटाई नहीं होगी उसे acquit कर दिया गया है

Synonyms: - exonerated, freed, manumitted, excused, etc.

Antonyms:- accused, condemned, convicted, etc.



E.g.:- He was acquitted of all the charges in the court today.

Modest:- not usually talking about or making obvious your own abilities and achievements: 귀되

Mnemonics :- medium सा

Synonyms: - diffident, humble, meek, shy, timid etc.

Antonyms:- arrogant, cocky, phony, conceit, etc.



E.g.:- Her modest behavior was appreciated by everyone in the assembly.

Aman Sir English

Perseverance:- resolve that allows one to continue with a duty or task regardless of difficulty or previous attempts Egal AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- persistent

Synonyms: - endurance, dedication, persistence, spunk, tenacity

Antonyms:- apathy, cowardice, indolence, laziness, lethargy, etc.



E.g.:- The disabled young man's perseverance allowed him to complete the marathon.



Messy:- producing or causing dirt and untidiness: गंदा, मैला **AMAN SIR ENGLISH**

Mnemonics :- hostel की mess में सब messy था

Synonyms: - sloppy, blotchy, grubby, slovenly, etc.

Antonyms:- systematic, clean, uncluttered, etc.



E.g.: The hurried hairdresser rarely fixed her own hair in the morning; instead she piled her wild locks into a messy bun and ran out the door.



Rowdy:- wild in a loud or typically obnoxious manner उपद्रवी, कोलाहलपूर्ण

Mnemonics:- rowdy rathore

Synonyms: - raucous, rebellious, rude, turbulent, lawless, etc.

Antonyms:-calm, manageable, obedient, subdued, restrained, etc.



E.g.:- The theater was full of rowdy teenagers throwing popcorn and yelling.

Apparently:- seemingly; it appears that स्पष्ट रूप से

Mnemonics:- transparent - apparent

Synonyms: - allegedly, ostensibly, possibly, probably, etc.

Antonyms:- improbably, unlikely, dubiously, uncertain, etc.



E.g.:- The restaurant is apparently out of ice, so it appears that we will have to drink warm tea.

Vague:- not clear or definite अस्पष्ट या अनिश्चित

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- वो गाँव के रीति रिवाज उसको vague लगते थे

Synonyms: - ambiguous, dubious, nebulous, obscure, etc.

Antonyms:- apparent, determined, distinct, explicit, obvious, etc.



E.g.:- Because Ramesh suffered a brain injury, he does not remember his childhood and has only a vague memory of his family.

Innuendo:- a remark that suggests something but does not refer to it directly, or this type of remark in general: इशारा^{AMAN SIR ENGLISH} Mnemonics :- इन दोनों का कुछ चल रहा है

Synonyms: - insinuation, allusion, aside, aspersion, etc.

Antonyms:- evidence, proof, etc.



E.g.:- Instead of being blunt with Hemant about his drug problem, I tried using an innuendo to catch his attention.

Extravagant:- costing a lot of money ख़र्चीला, बहुत महँगा AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- extra खर्ची at vacation

Synonyms: - lavish, overpriced, pricey, upscale, etc.

Antonyms:- economical, reasonable, worthless, cheap, etc.



E.g.:- The diamond necklace was far too extravagant for a simple dinner party.


Lament:- to express sorrow or regret; to mourn aloud विलाप करना

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- lame comment मार के feel हुआ lament

Synonyms: - bemoan, regret, sorrow, repine, bawl, etc.

Antonyms:- be happy, relieve, celebrate, compliment, laud, etc.




E.g.:- I deeply lament the lost opportunity to reconnect with my grandmother before she died.

Wane:- to gradually decrease in value or intensity कम होना
AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Synonyms: - abate, ebb, fade, shrink, slacken, subside, etc. Antonyms: - brighten, enhance, expand, extend, etc.



E.g.:- When the investigators ran out of leads, the intensity of the murder investigation started to wane.

Veteran:- one who has a lot of experience in a particular field or position अनुभवी

Mnemonics:- war veteran

Synonyms: - adept, steady, worldly, proficient, versed, etc.

Antonyms:- unskilled, green, inexperienced, etc.



E.g.:- She is veteran journalist known for her powerful writing style.



Coherent:- easy to understand, hear, read, or see: स्पष्ट AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics: - apparent - coherent

Synonyms: - consistent, intelligible, logical, lucid, systematic etc.

Antonyms:- opaque, ambiguous, obscure, vague, etc.



E.g.:- This poet has a style that makes his work more coherent than most poetry that I've read lately

Fetish:- obsession for something

Mnemonics :- फटी हुई socks जमां करने का fetish

Synonyms: - penchant, affection, affinity, etc.

Antonyms:- antipathy, disinclination, dislike, hate, hatred, etc.



E.g.:- Her fetish about the colour aqua is well known to all her friends.

Dishevel:- to make something disordered or untidy बिखेरना/गन्दा करना AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- dis + shelves

Synonyms: - bedraggled, messy, rumpled, untidy, etc.

Antonyms:- clean, neat, ordered, orderly, tidy, unwrinkled, etc.



E.g.:- The playing children tried not to dishevel their dresses because they knew mother would be angry if their school clothes looked messy.

Rectify:- replace or repair machinery, equipment, and fittings in a ship, building, etc. सुधारना

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:-Re(again) + Fit

Synonyms: - ameliorate, cure, heal, rebuild, reconstruct, etc.

Antonyms:- injure, worsen, break, destroy, ruin, etc.



E.g.:- The best way to rectify the children's poor test grades is to reteach the lesson and give a second test.

Camouflage:- to use leaves, branches, paints, or clothes to hide soldiers or military equipment so that they cannot be seen against the area around them: भेष बदलना

Mnemonics :- chameleon करता है best camouflage

Synonyms: - disguise, mask, veil, mimicry, guise, etc.

Antonyms:- reveal, exposure, disclosure, etc.



E.g.:- The troops had camouflaged themselves so effectively that the enemy didn't notice them approaching. SIR ENGLISH


Grievance:- an aggravation or complaint शिकायत

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- grieve

Synonyms: - grief, hardship, injustice, objection, outrage, etc.

Antonyms:- delight, happiness, joy, etc.



E.g.:- The company's grievance policy requires you to contact your direct supervisor to make a harassment claim.

Incompetent:- not having the ability to do something as it should had done: 3 do something as it should AMAN SIR ENGLISH

be done: अकुशल; असमर्थ

Mnemonics:- in + compete

Synonyms: - amateurish, inefficient, inept, etc.

Antonyms:- competent, adept, dexterous, proficient, skillful, etc.



E.g.:- When I hired the cook, I did not know he was so incompetent he could not boil an egg.



Compulsory:- required by regulations or laws; obligatory:
अनिवार्य

Mnemonics :- compulsion

Synonyms: - imperative, mandatory, obligatory, imperious, etc.

Antonyms:- inessential, voluntary, liberalized, liberated, etc.



E.g.:- The law made wearing seat belts in cars compulsory.

Bumpy:- not flat or smooth ऊबड़-खाबड़, झटका देनेवाला

AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:-bump

Synonyms: - choppy, jarring, jerky, rugged, rutted, etc.

Antonyms:- even, level, smooth, etc.



E.g.:- He was riding his bike on a bumpy surface.

Dust:- to cover something with a light powder: छिड़कना
AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Synonyms: -sprinkle, scatter, dredge, sift, freckle, etc.

Antonyms:- gather, collect, etc.



E.g.:- The confectioner dusted a fine layer of sugar on the muffin.

Dust:- to clean a room, furniture, etc. by removing dust with a cloth कपड़े से कमरा, फर्नीचर आदि की धूल झाड़ना AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Synonyms: - elegant, graceful, hygienic, immaculate, neat, etc. Antonyms: - cluttered, dirty, disorderly, disorganized, filthy, etc.



E.g.:- I cleaned the glass coffee table, dusted all the dusty spots, and then scrubbed the stove.

Superficial:- concerned with only what is on the surface सतही
AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- upar facial

Synonyms: - depthless, exterior, external, etc.

Antonyms:- Profound, mature, sensible, significant, wise, etc.



E.g.:- The president's concern for the homeless people was superficial and ended as soon as the media left the event.

Jubilant:- extremely happy, especially because of a success अत्यधिक प्रसन्न

Mnemonics :- jubilee पे jubilant

Synonyms: - elated, euphoric, exultant, joyous, triumphal, etc.

Antonyms:- melancholic, depressed, discouraged, sorrowful, etc.



E.g.:- The fans were jubilant at their team's victory.

Mnemonics:- flower flourish

Synonyms: - cultivate, develop, expand, grow, gain, etc.

Antonyms:- shrink, narrow, neglect, raze, recede, reduce, etc.



E.g.:- The fertile ground and ample water supply will allow the crops to flourish.

Ecstatic:- very happy or full of joy आनंदमय; ख़ुश; हर्षपूर्ण AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- एक शतक मारने के बाद ecstatic

Synonyms: - joyous, exuberant, festive, joyful, jubilant, etc.

Antonyms:- melancholic, gloomy, grave, sorrowful, etc.



E.g.:- When a snow day was announced, the students were ecstatic to miss a day of school.

Absurd:- stupid and unreasonable, or silly in a humorous way: मूर्खतापूर्ण, बेतुका

Mnemonics :- तेरे absurd से comment से वो सड़ गया है

Synonyms: - foolish, goofy, ludicrous, preposterous, silly, etc.

Antonyms:- sensible, realistic, reasonable, responsible, etc.



E.g.:- Spending the week in jail for stealing a loaf of bread is an absurd punishment for such a minor crime.

Forbid:- to not allow something, or to order someone not to do something: किसी को कोई काम करने से मना करना AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics :- bid लगाने से forbid करना

Synonyms: - deny, deprive, disallow, enjoin, exclude, etc.

Antonyms:- allowed, assist, encourage, facilitate, include, etc.



E.g.:- The teacher tried to forbid the students from using their cell phones, but they wouldn't listen to her.

Frugal:- careful in spending money: किफायती, मितव्ययी
AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- few girlfriend

Synonyms: - canny, meticulous, prudent, stingy, thrifty, etc.

Antonyms:- extravagant, spendthrift, generous, lavish, etc.



E.g.:- I wanted front row seats, but my frugal husband wanted to save a bundle by purchasing back row seats.

Tedious:- boring and tiring, esp. because long or often repeated:
থকাক

Mnemonics :- टेढ़े मेढ़े रास्तों पर गाड़ी चलाना tedious हो जाता है

Synonyms: - annoying, banal, boring, dreary, endless, etc.

Antonyms:- eventful, exciting, facile, interesting, pleasant, etc.



E.g.:- The professor's lectures are very conventional and so tedious.

Accomplice:- a person who helps somebody to do something bad, especially a crime अपराध करने में सहायक व्यक्ति AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- company in crime

Synonyms: - aide, collaborator, conspirator, abettor, etc.

Antonyms:- antagonist, enemy, adversary, Opponent, etc.



E.g.:- The police are hoping the accomplice will lead them to the mastermind of the crime.

Persuade:- to make somebody do something by giving him/her good reasons राज़ी करना

Mnemonics :- purse लेलो 100 में

Synonyms: - assure, cajole, coax, enlist, entice, exhort, etc.

Antonyms:- discourage, dissuade, halt, prevent, repel, etc.



E.g.:- While most friends persuaded him to choose the career, there were a few who dissuaded him from doing so.

Dismal:- causing or showing sadness; depression निराशाजनक AMAN SIR ENGLISH

Mnemonics:- favourite batsman dismissal

Synonyms: - afflictive, boring, cheerless, desolate, despondent

Antonyms:- lively, encouraging, favorable, joyful, etc.



E.g.:- The musician gave a dismal performance of a few old melodies at last night's concert.

Aman Sir English

Chide:- to speak to someone severely because they have behaved AMAN SIR ENGLISH

badly: डांटना

Mnemonics :- child को अक्सर किया जाता है chide

Synonyms: - admonish, berate, castigate, censure, rebuke, etc.

Antonyms:- applaud, compliment, exonerate, flatter, laud, etc.



E.g.:- I don't want the boss to chide me for being late again, so I'm setting the alarm for a half hour earlier.

Prohibition:- the act of officially not allowing something, or an order that does this: निषेध

Mnemonics :- प्रतिबंधित

Synonyms: - constraint, embargo, exclusion, prevention, etc.

Antonyms:- allowance, permission, approval, clearance, etc.



E.g.:- New York City has announced a prohibition on smoking on buses.

Intentional:- on purpose, planned and deliberate जान-बूझकर Mnemonics :- इनके बीच में tension चल रही थी इसलिए intentional hit था वो

Synonyms: - premeditated, voluntary, willful, etc.

Antonyms:- involuntary, unwilling, accidental, unplanned, etc.



E.g.:- The other driver claims that the accident wasn't intentional and that he rammed his car into mine accidentally, not on purpose.

Selective:- careful when choosing चयन करने में सावधान Synonyms: - particular, choosy, picky, choosey, judicious sir English discerning, etc.

Antonyms:- careless, thoughtless, unfussy, unscrupulous, etc.



E.g.:- As a teacher she was very selective, accepting only a small number of exceptionally gifted pupils.

Exultant:- very happy, especially at someone else's defeat or AMAN SIR ENGLISH

failure: बहुत खुश

Mnemonics :- excellent performance के बाद exultant

Synonyms: - delighted, ecstatic, elated, joyous, jubilant, etc.


Antonyms:- disconsolate, depressed, miserable, sorrowful, etc.



E.g.:- The crowd gave an exultant cheer to the football team when they were exiting the airport.

Cognizant:- knowledgeable of something, especially through personal experience जानकार

Synonyms: - apprehensive, conscious, judicious, observant, etc. Antonyms: - ignorant, indifferent, unaware, unmindful, etc.



E.g.:- My teenage daughter will not become cognizant of the dangers of driving until she gets her license.

Aman Sir English

Object:- give a reason why you think something is wrong ऐतराज करना, आपत्ति उठाना

Synonyms: - Protest, Disapprove, disagreement, complain, etc.

Antonyms:- approve, support, endorse, etc.



E.g.:- I object to the false claims made against me.

Incessant:- never stopping, especially in an annoying or AMAN SIR ENGLISH

unpleasant way: लगातार

Mnemonics:-insist

Synonyms: - ceaseless, constant, interminable, perpetual, etc.

Antonyms:- sporadic, ceasing, ending, finished, etc.



E.g.: The village fair was cancelled due to incessant rains.

Aman Sir English

Conceal:- to put out of sight or hide from scrutiny (किसी से कुछ) छुपाना; गुप्त रखना

Mnemonics :- m seal लगा के conceal

Synonyms: - bury, cover, hide, mask, obscure, stash, etc.

Antonyms:- reveal, uncover, unwrap, divulge, expose, etc.



E.g.:- The killer attempted to conceal the murder by chopping the victim's body into small pieces.

Aman Sir English

Amateur:- one who does a thing for pleasure not as a profession शौकीन व्यक्ति

Mnemonics :- आम तौर से amateur gli mohale me hi khelte hain

Synonyms: - abecedarian, aspirant, beginner, dabbler, etc.

Antonyms:- boring, virtuoso, wizard, boffin, etc.



E.g.:- My niece is an amateur artist. I hope she become famous one day.
