Word-Bib, Meaning - to drink.

Bibulous – drunkard.

Eg:- Tarun is fed up with the doings of his bibulous neighbour.

Imbibe - drink alcohol.

Eg:- Both men imbibed considerable amount of wine.

Imbibe - to absorb ideas or knowledge.

Eg:- Shalini had imbibed the traditions of her family.

Word-Bib, Meaning - to drink.

Bibber - a person who regularly drinks a specified drink.

Bibulousness - the state of being drunkard.

Eg:- Dev was divining his car in bibulousness and police fined him for that.

Imbiber – drinker.

Eg:-Engineers are the true imbibers of tea and alcohol.

Bellicose – very eager to fight.

Eg:- I don't like his bellicose attitude.

Bellicism - war-mindedness.

Eg:- He was not liked by anyone because of his bellicism.

Bellipotent – powerful in fight or war.

Eg:- His aggression was the bellipotent which helped him in the war.

Word - Belly-belli, Meaning - War/fight.

Casus belli - cause of war.

Eg:-Water will be the casus belli of the 3rd world war.

Bellona - goddess of war.

Eg:- Ma Kali is like a Bellona in Hindu religion.

Rebellious - Tending to fight/war.

Eg:- My brother has a rebellious nature and he always fights with me.

Word – Peri, Meaning – Around.

Peripatetic - walking around walking from one place to another.

Eg:- Aman sir is a peripatetic teacher who loves to walk around.

Periphrastic - Talking in a roundabout way.

Eg:- I don't like people who talks in a periphrastic manner.

Word – Peri, Meaning – Around.

Perimeter - measurement of around.

Eg:- A river runs along one side of the field's perimeter.

Periphery – surroundings.

Eg:- Homeopathy is on the periphery of medical practice.

Word – Epi, Meaning – Upon.

Epigraph - a quotation at the head of a chapter.

Eg:-The epigraph of this book is going to be 'Error pro'.

Epitaph - written upon tomb.

Eg:- Raheem read the epitaph loudly which was written on the grave of his friend.

Epidermis - upon layer.

Eg:- You should apply the cream on your epidermis if you feel itching on it.

Word-Oculus, Meaning - eye

Ocular: related to eye.

Eg:- One should always take care of one's ocular muscles.

Monocle - A lens for one eye.

Eg:- I am having problem in seeing that is why I bought a monocle.

Binoculars - glasses that increase the range of two eyes.

Eg:- With the help of binoculars, bird watchers may see and identify birds beyond the range of normal human eyesight.

Oculated - having eyes.

Genealogy - study of family line.

Eg:- I became interested in the genealogy of my family.

Genesis – origin.

Eg:- The story had its genesis in a conversation the author had with his mother.

Genealogist - one who traces genealogies.

Generic - belonging to a race or kind.

Eg:- The new range of engines all had a generic problem with their fan blades.

Genetic – related to genes or heredity.

Eg:- Everyone has some genetic defects.

Genus - stock, category.

Eg:- Genus is a group or category in which animals or plants are devided.

Genres - A species/ a kind/ a type.

Eg:- There are different genres of the music in our country.

Progeny - offspring, descendants children.

Eg:- His numerous progeny are scattered all over the country.

Indigenous - Inborn, innate.

Eg:- Tejas is a indigenous aircraft of Indian Air Force.

Word-Noctic/noct/nox, Meaning-Night

Equinoctial - related to equal day and night.

Eg:- I started my project in the equinoctial period last year.

Equinox - equal day and night.

Eg:- Equinox is a time in a year when day and night are of same length.

Noctambulate - noct (night) + ambul (walk) - to walk at night while sleeping.

Eg:- Ganesh has a bad habit of noctambulate in the night.

Noctilucous - shining at night.

Eg:- The environment was very romantic in the noctilucous light of the moon.

Nocturnal - Active at night.

Eg:- Satish paid a nocturnal visit to the flat.

Nocturne - A music inspired by night.

Eg:- Shamsher, my dog likes to sleep after listening to nocturne.

Word - Voc/Vok/Vox, Meaning - Voice/Sound.

Vocable - A human sound, a word.

Eg:- This book has certain vocables from English, Sanskrit and Malyalam.

Vocal - Relating to the voice, oral.

Eg:- Don't be so vocal in the interview, you might get rejected.

Vocabulary - A collection of words and phrases.

Eg:- One should have a fantastic vocabulary to clear the SSC exam with good marks.

Word - Voc/Vok/Vox, Meaning - Voice/Sound.

Vocabulist - a maker of vocabularies.

Eg:- Sometimes I think that I shoud be a vocabulist.

Vocalize - to sing/to give/ utterance.

Eg:- Ravi vocalized as a lion behind my back to frighten me but failed to do so.

Invoke - to cite for support.

Eg:- During his speech, he invoked the memory of his mother.

Word – Pan, Meaning-All

Panacea - a cure for all.

Eg: There is no panacea for the country's economic problems.

Panarchy (Rule) - rule by all means universal rule.

Eg:- Panarchy is a system in which each person has absolute power.

Pandemic (People) - Relating to all people.

Eg:- A big portion of the society is suffering from the Cancer pandemic.

Word – Pan, Meaning-All

Pantheist - one who believes all Gods.

Eg:- Shalu does not have any problem in going to a church, she is a pantheist.

Pangenesis - Origin from all cells.

Pantisocracy - Rule by all.

Eg:-Pantisocracy is what we all want in our country.

Word – Pan, Meaning-All

Panharmonic – relqted to universal harmony.

Eg:- I want panharmonic atmosphere.

Pansophy - pan (all) + sophos (wisdom) -Universal wisdom Eg: Studying theology allowed the students to ascertain that god's pansophy enabled believers to put their faith in him.

Pantheon - A temple dedicated to all gods.

Eg:- As part of their course, mythology students visited the pantheon in the ancient village.

Word-Ridi/risi, Meaning-laughter.

Ridibund – which causes laughter.

Eg:- Ridibund Jokes

Ridicule - to mock at somebody.

Eg:-He had become an object of ridicule among the other teachers.

Ridiculer - One who mock at another.

Eg:- I always hit the ridiculer with my witty comments.

Word-Ridi/risi, Meaning-laughter.

Ridiculous – Laughable.

Eg:- When I asked the reports on the project my juniors presented a ridiculous report in front of me.

Risible - laughable.

Eg:-Oh please! Do not give me your risible suggestions.

Deride - to make mock.

Eg:-The party was derided as totally lacking in ideas.

Word-Ridi/risi, Meaning-laughter.

Derisive - causing mocking laughter.

Eg:- When I told them about my plans, I got a derisive laughter in return.

Derisively – Mockingly.

Eg:- I can not talk to anybody derisively and you should not force me to do it.

Monandry - mono (one) + ander (male) - The custom of having one husband at a time.

Eg:- Monoandry should be the custom of every religion.

Monogyny - The custom of having one wife.

Eg:- Monogyny is a custom of Hindu religion.

Monarch - a ruler.

Eg:- Kim Jong Un is the monarch of North Korea.

Monarchy - A government of one ruler.

Eg:-Monarchy system was an old trend in India, it is not relevant now.

Monochord - An instrument of one string.

Eg:- Aashish plays monochord very well, he should try to give auditions.

Monody -A funeral song by one voice.

Monogamy - one marriage.

Eg:- Monogamy is the best custom to live a happy life.

Monodrama - A play with one actor.

Eg:- His partner is ill today so he has to convert their play into a monodrama.

Monocracy - Government by one ruler.

Eg:- North Korea has monocracy.

Monochromatic - of one colour only.

Exp:- Shalini likes to wear monochromatic clothes.

Monotone - sameness. (single tone).

Eg:- He answered all the lawyer's questions in a dull monotone.

Word – Bi, Meaning - Two

Bifocals – having two lenses.

Eg:- Bifocals are special glasses with an upper part made for seeing things that are far away.

Bifurcate – Divide into two parts.

Eg:- Dividers bifurcate the road.

Biannual – occurring one time in two years.

Eg:- A biannual report of the expenses is produced in front of finance minister.

Word – Bi, Meaning - Two

Biped - ped(legs) - having two legs.

Eg:- Man is biped animal.

Bicentennial - two hundred years.

Eg:- Government is preparing for the bicentennial celebrations.

Bipartisan - for both the parties.

Eg:- A bipartisan committee is formed to solve the issues of both the parties.

Word – Bi, Meaning - Two

Binoculars - having two lenses.

Eg:- I have 2 pairs of binoculars and I won't give any one of them to you.

Bilateral - bi (two) + lateral (sides) - two sides.

Eg:- The bilateral relations of India and Pakistan are not good.

Word - Theo/the/theism/theistic, Meaning God/deity

Allotheism - The worship of other or strange gods.

Antitheism - Anti + theism - The belief that there is no god.

Antitheist - a person who is opposed to belief in the existence of god.

Apotheosis - The transportation of a human being into a god.

Word - Theo/the/theism/theistic, Meaning God/deity

Theology - Study of god.

Theologian - one who studies god.

Atheologian - one who is opposed to the study of god.

Theism - belief in god.

Eg:- Tanisha always backs her theisem.

Word - Theo/the/theism/theistic, Meaning God/deity

Theist - one who believes in god.

Eg:- I am a pure theist.

Atheist - A + Theist - One who does not believe in God.

Monotheist - One who believes in one God.

Eg:- Aadarsh is a monoatheist and he owns it.

Word - Nat & Nasc, Meaning - to be born

Natal - Relating to birth.

Eg:- Green turtles return to their natal island to breed.

Native - Belonging to by birth.

Eg:- English is not the native language for Indians.

Nativity - The process of being born.

Eg:- The picture you see is the nativity scene of the birth of Jesus Christ.

Word - Nat & Nasc, Meaning - to be born

Nativism - A policy of favouring the native person same place. Eg:- In India because of nativism many people could not get the opportunities they should get.

Naturalise - to give citizenship to the foreign born.

Eg:- British couples are asking the Indian government to naturalise them.

Innate – Inborn.

Eg:- Children have an innate ability to learn language.

Word - Nat & Nasc, Meaning - to be born

Renascent – reborn.

Eg:- Voters have come back to a renascent BJP.

Nascent- growing stage.

Eg:- Pakistan has a nascent democracy.

Word - Clam / Claim Meaning - Cry out/say/shout.

Exclaim - To say in an enthusiastic way.

Eg:- They all exclaimed over her beautiful clothes.

Clamour - noisy shouting.

Eg:-People was clamouring outside the Parliament.

Proclamation - Official statement.

Eg:- The govt got a bad effect on its image after the proclamation of this new policy.

Word - Clam / Claim Meaning - Cry out/say/shout.

Proclaim - to say in an official way.

Eg:- His son was immediately proclaimed king.

Reclamation - to claim again.

Eg:- This land will be used for building a house after reclamation.

Acclaim - to praise by saying nice words.

Eg:- Prime Minister acclaimed the IAS officers for their hard work.

Word – Fort, Meaning – Strong.

Fort - an enclosure which is considered to be very strong.

Eg:- In Indian almost every district has a fort which is a tourism spot.

Fortress – A strong or invincible fort.

Eg:- The fortress fell after a nine day siege.

Fortify - to strengthen the area.

Eg:- It is necessary to each and every country to fortify their main cities.

Word – Fort, Meaning – Strong.

Forte - Strong area/field.

Eg:- I have to study hard in chemistry because the subject is definitely not my forte.

Fortitude - courage in pain.

Eg:- One should always show the fortitude in one's bad times.

Word - Grad/Gress, Meaning - Step, go, move.

Gradual - slowly move.

Eg:- Lion in the jungle takes a gradual move to hunt the deer.

Progress - to move ahead.

Eg:- Everybody want themselves to progress in their life.

Retrogress - to move backward.

Eg:- Nobody likes to retrogress in their life.

Word - Grad/Gress, Meaning - Step, go, move.

Regress - Going back.

Eg:- Pakistani Army was regressing after their defeat in the war of 1971.

Transgress - go beyond the limits of.

Eg:-Indian army only know about transgressing, regressing is not taught to them.

Word – CRED Meaning – Believe

Creed - A set of belief.

Eg:- Marxism has never been weaker as a political creed.

Creditable - Can be believed.

Eg:-The team produced a creditable performance.

Creditably - In such a manner that something is believed.

Eg:- The team has completed the task creditably.

Word – CRED Meaning – Believe

Discreditable - Not worthy of belief.

Eg:- Do not make yourself discreditable by doing these type of things.

Credulous - Inclined to believe readily.

Eg:-Wasim is a credulous guy and I can trick him easily.

Incredulous - Not inclined to believe.

Eg:- Don't try to trick the engineers they are not incredulous.

Word – CRED Meaning – Believe

Incredulously – distrustingly.

Eg:- Aashish was praising me incredulously.

Credulously – trustingly.

Eg:- Sana was offering help credulously.

Credence – belief.

Eg:-His ideas quickly gained credence among economists.
