

1. Resentment:- A feeling of anger or unhappiness about something that you think is unfair. {क्रोध या रोष}

➤ **Mnemonics:-** sentiment hurt hue hain to resentment to hoga hi

Synonyms:- Bitterness, Anger, Animosity

Antonyms:- Comfort, Delight, Calmness

Eg:- After several years of dealing with her husband's cheating, bitterness and resentment had built up in the wife's heart.



2.Pompous:- Showing that you think you are more important than other people especially by using long and formal words.
{आडंबरपूर्ण तरीके से,दिखावा}

Antonyms:- Humble, Modest, Selfless

3. Keen:- Wanting to do something very much {उत्सुक}

Mnemonics:- keen to clean



Synonyms:- Eager, Anxious, Ardent

Antonyms:- Apathetic, Calm, Indifferent

Eg:- You need a keen sense of observation to do well as a private investigator.

4.Heckle:- To interrupt discussion by asking difficult questions or rude comments {सवालों से बात काटना}

Synonyms:- Bully, Interrupt, Rattle

Antonyms:- Please, Praise, Support

Eg:- As they began to heckle the speaker with insulting gestures, the two protesters were escorted from the building.

Eg:- The movie critic took every opportunity to deride the A-list actor for making the awful film.

8.Exaltation:- A feeling or state of extreme happiness. {उमंग}

Synonyms:- Acclaim, Glory, Applause

Antonyms:- Criticism, Disdain, Scorn

Eg:- Tina yelled in exaltation when she saw the car her parents bought her.

9.Rotate:- To move something in a circle {घूमना}

Synonyms:- Revolve, Twist, Spin

Antonyms:- Straighten, Untwist

Eg:- The Earth does rotate on its axis near the sun so that each part of the Earth get daylight and night.

10.Scrutiny:- Careful and detailed examination of something in order to get information about it. {जांच}

Mnemonics:- security wale scrutiny karte hain

Synonyms:- Analysis, Review, Audit

Antonyms:- Glimpse, Sight, Peek

Eg:- If you want to fly on an airplane, you should be prepared to deal with scrutiny from the airline personnel.

Antonyms:- Unable, Insufficient, Incompetent

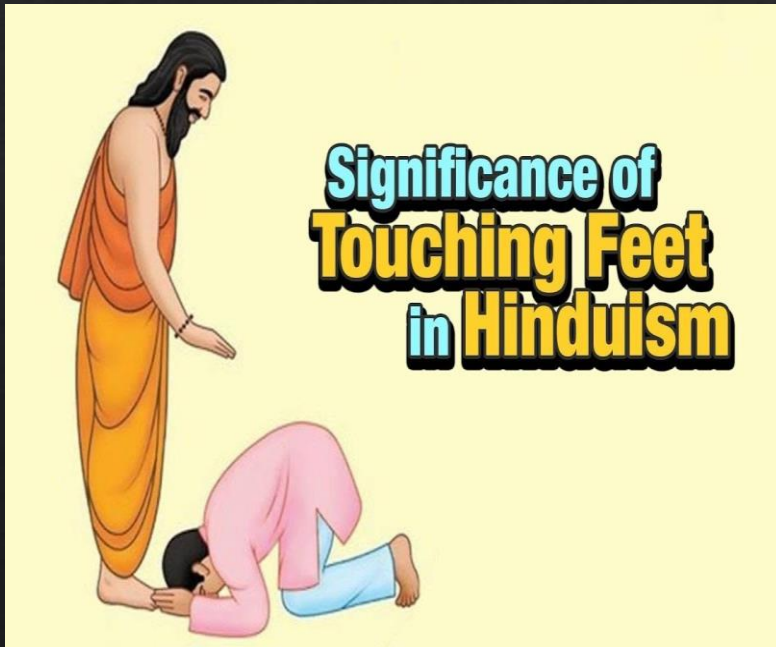
Eg:- Although the surgery is a difficult one, a competent surgeon will have no problem performing the operation.

Eg:- My perpetual struggle with alcohol is a strain on my marriage.

Synonyms:- Suffocation, Smothering

Eg:- The deputies pinned Saylor to the ground, and he died of asphyxiation.



15.Bizarre:- Very strange {विचित्र}

Mnemonics:- bazar me bizarre harkate tik tok ke liye

Synonyms:- Odd, Absurd, Insane

Antonyms:- Reasonable, Realistic

Eg:- On her trip around the world, Bridgett found the custom of eating snake quite bizarre.



16. Tranquil:- Relaxed; Peaceful { शांत }

19.Obligatory:- that you must do {अनिवार्य}

Antonyms:- Unnecessary, Optional, Voluntary

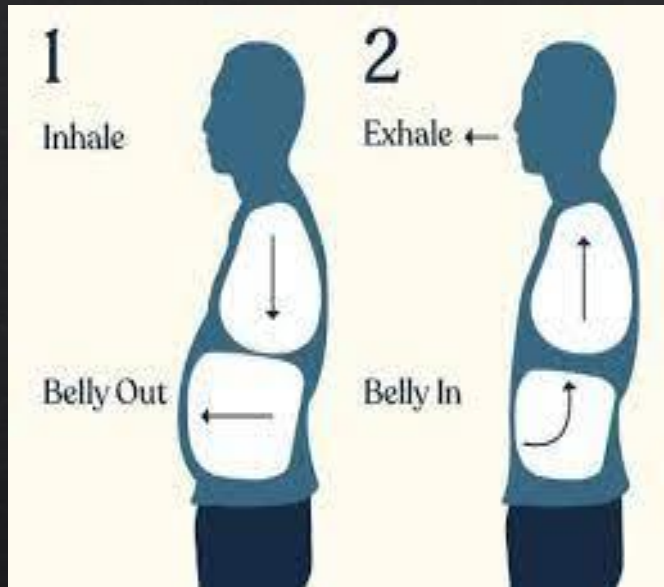
Eg:- The medical examination before you start work is obligatory.

Synonyms:- Emitting, Blowing out

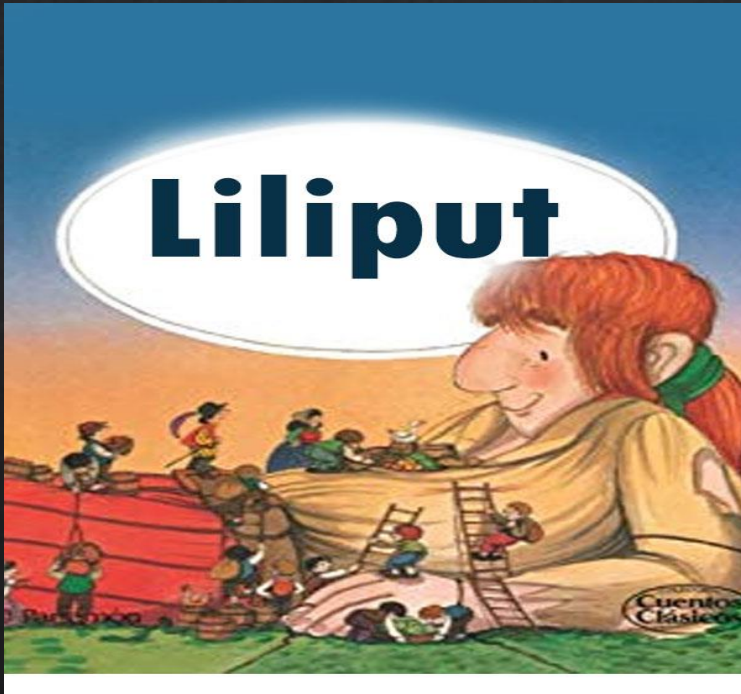
Antonyms:- Inhale, Inbreathing

Eg:- When the actress took off her blouse in public, she shocked everyone with her brazen behavior.

23.Defunct:- No longer existing {निष्क्रिय}

Eg:- Realizing the elevator was defunct, they were forced to take the stairs instead.

25. Antiquated:- From the past, old fashioned { प्राचीन }

Eg:- Since Abha stopped attending piano practice,
her playing skill has started to deteriorate.

29.Enchanting:- Captivating or charming {मोहक}

Antonyms:- Repugnant, Boring, Revolting

Eg:- It was enchanting to have a wedding in a massive cathedral that was filled with ancient architecture and art.

Eg:- In order to make sure everyone knew the details of the plan, the commander decided to specify the role of each individual soldier on his team.

Antonyms:- Repulsive, Repugnant, Revolting

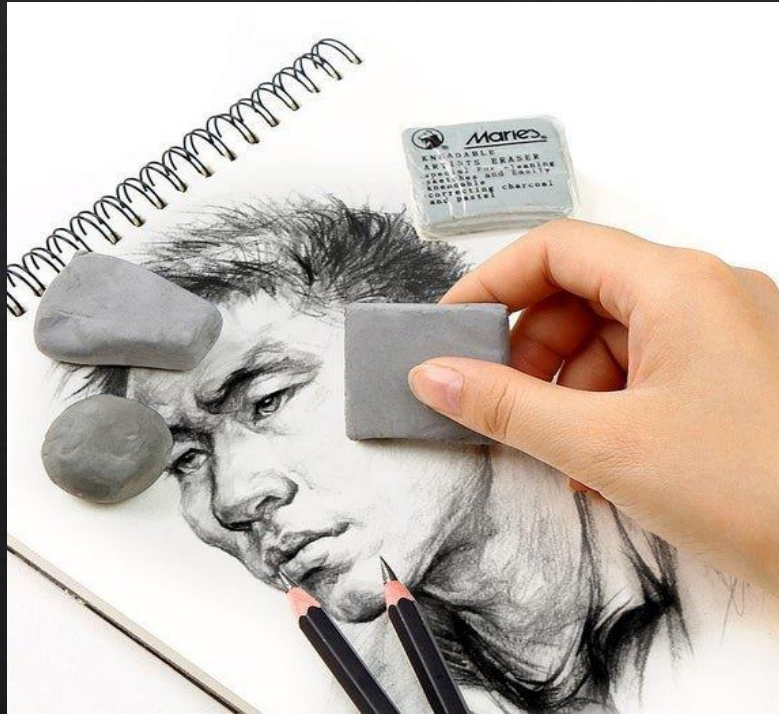
Eg:- The singer's voice was bewitching, and its captivating sound brought listeners from miles away.
