

**1. Indispensable:-** As in necessary, Too important  
{अनिवार्य, जरूरी}

**Mnemonics:-** jisko dispense na kiya ja sake



**Synonyms:-** Vital, Crucial, Imperative

**Antonyms:-** Additional, Secondary, Trivial

**Eg:-** The pharmacist is indispensable when it comes to operating a pharmacy.

**3.Transient:-** Continuing for only a short time  
{अस्थायी}

**Mnemonics:-** train ek minute me chali jayegi

**Synonyms:-** Fleeting, Brief, Volatile

**Antonyms:-** Enduring, Lengthy, Perpetual

**Eg:-** The snow is transient and will melt  
as soon as the sun appears.

**3.Prolific:-** Highly productive {फलवान}

**Mnemonics:-** highly productive

**Synonyms:-** Productive, Rich, Abundant

**Antonyms:-** Barren, Unproductive, Fruitless

**Eg:-** Every team in the league wanted the prolific soccer player.

**4. Conceit:-** The fact of being too proud of yourself and what you do {अकड}

**Mnemonics:-** kon baith gya meri seat pe



**Synonyms:-** Egotism, Arrogance, Pride

**Antonyms:-** Modesty, Humility, Timidity

**Eg:-** Nothing is more aggravating than someone with so much conceit that they think they are perfect or incapable of error.

**5.Tolerance:-** The quality of being willing to accept or capacity to endure pain. {धैर्य, सहनशीलता}

**Mnemonics:-** tolerate



**Synonyms:-** Patience, Resilience, Toughness

**Antonyms:-** Lethargy, Weakness, Intolerance

**Eg:-** Since none of the passengers on the plane complained about the constantly screaming baby, they had a high tolerance to the noise.

**6.Precise:-** Clear and accurate {स्पष्ट}

**Root word:-** cise ( to cut )

**Synonyms:-** Actual, Definite, Exact

**Antonyms:-** Ambiguous, Improper, Vague

**Eg:-** The student tried to come up with the precise answer to the problem but was a few answers off.

**7. Compassionate:-** Displaying concern or understanding towards other people {दयालु}

**Mnemonics:-** kam paise walo ke prati hume compassionate hona chahiye

**Synonyms:-** Benevolent, Charitable, Humane

**Antonyms:-** Cruel, Malevolent, Unfriendly

**Eg:-** The compassionate man donated half of his yearly salary to local charities.

**8. Predicament:-** Difficult, unpleasant situation {संकट}

**Mnemonics:-** paer in the cement

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Quandary, Imbroglio, Crisis

**Antonyms:-** Advantage, Benefit, Blessing

**Eg:-** Because I do not want to end up in a financial predicament, I pay my bills regularly.

**9.Promptly:-** In a quick manner {फुर्ती से}

**Mnemonics:-** promotion ki baat sunte hi promptly reply karega



**Synonyms:-** Rapidly, Expeditiously, Instantly

**Antonyms:-** Slowly, Late, Negligently

**Eg:-** Fortunately, the paramedics arrived promptly and were able to save my father.

**10. Flung:-** To throw or push something with force especially because you are angry {फेंकना, छितराना}

**Mnemonics:-** fly thing

**Synonyms:-** Heaved, Launched, Propelled

**Antonyms:-** Held, Caught

**Eg:-** Katie flung a shoe at the domineering man with the jewel-toned eyes.

**11.Decipher:-** To succeed in finding meaning of something that is difficult to understand. {गुप्त लेख को पढ़ना}

**Mnemonics:-** cyber expert ne code ko decipher kar dia



**Synonyms:-** Interpret, Solve, Unravel

**Antonyms:-** Conceal, Confuse, Mend

**Eg:-** There was no way I could decipher my doctor's handwriting.



**12.Adjourn:-** To suspend or conclude an event  
{कुछ समय के लिए रोकना}

**Mnemonics:-** judge ne court ko adjourn kar dia



**Synonyms:-** Defer, Delay, Postpone

**Antonyms:-** Advance, Carry out, Expedite

**Eg:-** Until the director finds another lead actress, we will adjourn the production of the film.

**13.Hesitate:-** To be slow to speak or act because you feel nervous {हिचकिचाना}

**Mnemonics:-** log hasenge ye sochke hum hesitate karte hain



**Synonyms:-** Dither, Falter, Stumble

**Antonyms:-** Persist, Continue

**Eg:-** My dad always told me not to hesitate when something feels right.

# 14. Catastrophe:- A disaster of huge proportions {तबाही}

**Root word:-** cata/cada (downfall)

**Synonyms:-** Adversity, Calamity, Crisis

**Antonyms:-** Advantage, Aid, Boon

**Eg:-** The governor referred to the destructive hurricane as a catastrophe.

## 15.Demarcation:- A dividing line {सीमा रेखा}

**Mnemonics:-** mark

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Division, Delimitation, Separation

**Antonyms:-** Unite, Unbound, Stand still

**Eg:-** A basketball court has many lines, but there is one demarcation right in the middle that divides the court in half.

**16. Tantalise** :- To make you want something that you cannot have {तरसाना}

**Mnemonics:-** tansen ki pudia ne usse tantalise kar dia

**Synonyms:-** Provoke, Tease, Entice

**Antonyms:-** Aid, Assist, Encourage

**Eg:-** Rajdhani restaurant offer excellent cuisine, with a great selection of authentic dishes to tantalize the taste buds.



**17.Corpulent:-** Having a large bulky body {मोटा}

**Mnemonics:-** cop ka pet latka hua



**Synonyms:-** Rotund, Obese, Weighty

**Antonyms:-** Skinny, Thin, Underweight

**Eg:-** After overeating for months, the skinny girl became somewhat corpulent.

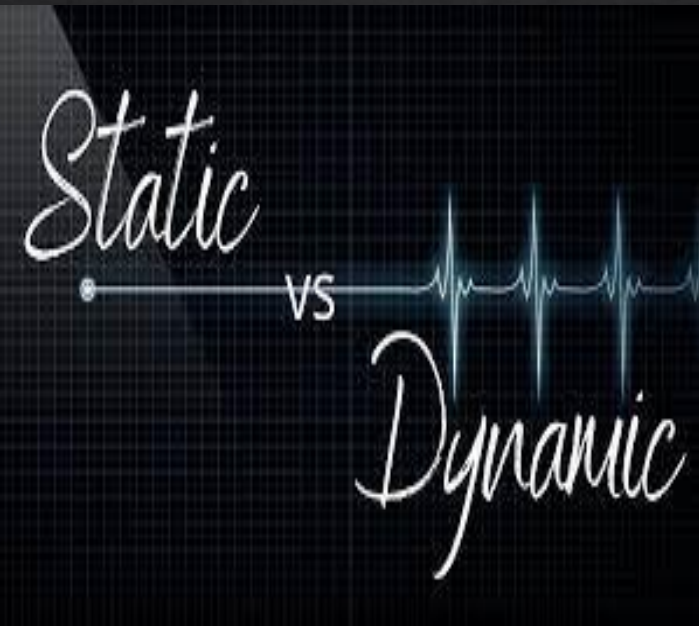


**18.Dynamic:-** Always active or changing {गतिशील}

**Synonyms:-** Energetic, Potent, Progressive

Aman Sir English

**Antonyms:-** Fruitless, Inactive, Lethargic



**Eg:-** Our company is seeking a dynamic president who can easily adapt our strategic goals to meet the ever-changing economy.

**19.Frantic:-** In a state of panic, worry, frenzy or rush  
{उत्तेजित, पागल}

**Mnemonics:-** frightened + panic



**Synonyms:-** Agitated, Angry, Distraught

**Antonyms:-** Balanced, Calm, Collected

**Eg:-** When Billy did not come home after school, his mother became frantic with worry.

**20.Soothe:-** To make somebody who is anxious, upset, feel calmer  
{शांत करना, आराम पहुँचाना}

**Mnemonics:-** maa se doodh pee bacha ho gya soothe



**Synonyms:-** Pacify, Appease, Soften

**Antonyms:-** Aggravate, Worsen, Trouble

**Eg:-** An apology did little to soothe the woman's hurt feelings or mend the grudge between the feuding siblings.



**21.Fervour:-** Great intensity of feeling or belief {जोश}

**Mnemonics:-** favourite player ke liye fervour



**Synonyms:-** Zeal, Enthusiasm, Ardor

**Antonyms:-** Apathy, Indifference, Lethargy

**Eg:-** The typical global fervor for the Olympics is lacking this year, making it less interesting than previous years.

## 22. Astonished:- Greatly surprised {हैरान}

**Mnemonics:-** aisa tune kaise kiya

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Amazed, Surprised, Stunned

**Antonyms:-** Unsurprised, Unimpressed, Indifferent

**Eg:-** After weeks of studying the Civil War, Kevin was astonished with his below average grade on his history test.

**23.Counterfeit:-** A fake version of an original item  
{नकली}

**Mnemonics:-** bank counter pe fate note chal jayenge but  
counterfeit nhi



**Synonyms:-** Bogus, Copy, Forged

**Antonyms:-** Actual, Authentic, Real

**Eg:-** The man was arrested for making  
counterfeit money.



**24.Feasibility:-** The possibility, capability, or likelihood of something being done or accomplished  
{होने की संभावना}

**Mnemonics:-** possibility



**Synonyms:-** Probability, Possibility, Workability

**Antonyms:-** Impracticability, Hopelessness, Impossibility

**Eg:-** A working party has been set up by the association to examine **feasibility** of the project.

**25.Elaborate:-** To explain in detail {विस्तार में कहना}

**Mnemonics:-** ye laboratory ki report se elaborate hoga  
kya issue hai

**Synonyms:-** Elucidate, Overdone, Detailed

**Antonyms:-** Unrefined, Uncultured, Easy

**Eg.:-** I will elaborate on the content of the report  
to make you understand in the best way  
possible.



**26.Paragon:-** A person who is perfect example of a particular good quality. { प्रमाण }

**Mnemonics:-** paragon chappal best example hain chappal ka



**Synonyms:-** Epitome, Exemplar, Apotheosis

**Antonyms:-** Flaw, Imperfection, Worst

**Eg:-** The editors of the magazine described the supermodel as a paragon of beauty.



**27.Essence:-** The key element of something {सारांश, तत्त्व}

**Mnemonics:-** essential part of something

**Synonyms:-** Crux, Basis, Element

**Antonyms:-** Abstract, Exterior, Exteriority

**Eg:-** According to educational psychologists,  
engagement is the essence of student learning.



**28.Procrastination:-** The act of delaying something that must be done {विलंब}

**Mnemonics:-** parso jaunga uss destination pe

**Synonyms:-** Delay, Loafing, Indecisiveness

**Antonyms:-** Hastening, Hurrying, Push

**Eg:-** She was smart, but her constant procrastination led her to be late with almost every assignment.



**29. Intervene:-** To interfere in an incident for a specific purpose {बीच में आना}

**Mnemonics:-** interfere



**Synonyms:-** Interfere, Involve, Meddle

**Antonyms:-** Leave alone, Ignore

**Eg:-** The teacher was injured when she tried to intervene in the fight between the two male students.



**30.Implies:-** Suggest that something is true that you feel without saying it directly {अर्थ निकालना}

**Synonyms:-** Alludes, Indirect, Unspoken

**Antonyms:-** Explicit, Spoken, Stated

Log kehte hai ladki  
hasi toh phasi



Maine to bahut ladkiyo ko hasaya  
par aaj tk ek bhi nahi phasi

**Eg:-** Arthur implied that he would love to go to Europe when he talked about traveling, but he didn't mention it specifically.

**31.Quell:-** To calm or reduce { घटाना, दबाना }

**Mnemonics:-** keep calm

**Synonyms:-** Suppress, Subdue, Subjugate

**Antonyms:-** Compliment, Build up, Aggravate

**Eg:-** Before Sarah gives a speech, she always drinks a shot of whiskey to quell her nerves.



**32.Repercussion:-** An indirect and usually a bad action or result {बदला,प्रतिक्रिया}

**Mnemonics:-** reaction



**Synonyms:-** Backlash, Impact, Reverberation

**Antonyms:-** Cause, Antecedent, Origin

**Eg:-** If you want to be able to shoot people without the fear of legal repercussion, you should consider becoming either a police officer or a military sniper.



**33.Hideous:-** Very ugly or unpleasant { घिनौना, डरावना }

**Mnemonics:-** wo apne hideous face ko hide karke rakhta tha



**Synonyms:-** Repulsive, Abominable, Dreadful

**Antonyms:-** Attractive, Beautiful, Pleasant

**Eg:-** The con man flashed a hideous smile, giving us the chills.

**34.Bleak:-** Devoid of enthusiasm or life {उदास}

**Mnemonics:-** future chances are very weak



**Synonyms:-** Austere, Chilly, Gloomy

**Antonyms:-** Bright, Friendly, Cheerful

**Eg:-** To the young girl, her upcoming marriage to the elderly man signaled a bleak future.



**35.Ravishing:-** Extremely beautiful {आकर्षक}

**Mnemonics:-** ravina tandon

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Alluring, Stunning, Enchanting

**Antonyms:-** Homely, Ugly

**Eg:-** The groom thought the bride looked ravishing in her wedding dress.

**36. Detest:-** To hate something very much {नफ़रत करना}

**Mnemonics:-** detest the taste of green vegetables

**Synonyms:-** Abhor, Despise, Loathe

**Antonyms:-** Admire, Cherish, Love

**Eg:-** Janet's parents detest her new boyfriend because he has a very bad reputation.



**37. Timid:-** Lacking in courage or confidence {डरपोक}

**Mnemonics:-** terrified



**Synonyms:-** Feeble, Modest, Nervous

**Antonyms:-** Bold, Courageous, Extroverted

**Eg:-** Having never held a snake before, the girl was very timid at handling the creature.

**38.Proposal:-** A plan or suggestion {सुझाव}

**Synonyms:-** Scheme, Outline, Setup

**Antonyms:-** Condemnation, Refusal



**Eg:-** A proposal to increase property taxes has been strongly opposed by homeowners.
