

# 1.Damp:- Slightly wet {नमी}

**Mnemonics:-** dam me pass ke gharon ki diwaren  
damp ho jati hai

**Synonyms:-** Dank, Cloudy, Moist

**Antonyms:-** Arid, Dry, Parched

**Eg:-** I didn't have a duster in the closet, so I simply used a damp paper towel to wipe the dust off of the furniture in the living room.

**2.Negligent:-** Characterized by lack of concern  
{ लापरवाह }

**Mnemonics:-** neglect karta hai important cheezo ho



**Synonyms:-** Inadvertent, Sloppy, Inattentive

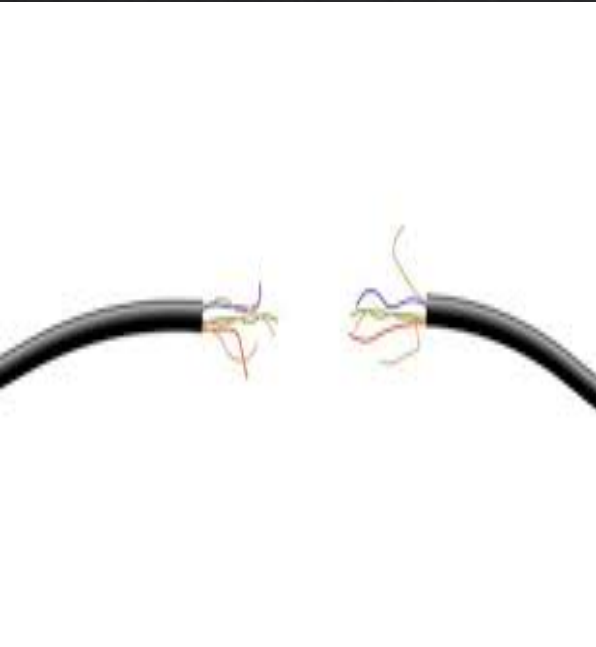
**Antonyms:-** Attentive, Caring, Mindful

**Eg:-** By failing to lock the door, Calvin  
Was deemed negligent.

**3.Discordant:-** Harsh or unpleasant in sound  
{ बेसुरा }

**Mnemonics:-** disconnect ho jati hai jab guitar cord to  
discordant awaj aati hai

**Synonyms:-** Cacophonous, Dissonant, Jarring

**Antonyms:-** Concordant, Harmonious, Agreeable

**Eg:-** Although Janice has been taking singing lessons for over a year, she still sounds discordant every time she performs.

**4.Placid:-** Not easily upset or excited {गंभीर}

**Mnemonics:-** Peaceful

**Eg:-** Even when the emergency room was packed with patients, the staff remained placid and calmly did their duties.

## 5. **Leniency**:- Quality of mercy or forgiveness {नरमी}

**Mnemonics**:- efficiency kam aai par father ne leniency dikhai

**Synonyms**:- Compassion, Tolerance, Kindness

**Antonyms**:- Cruelty, Meanness, Intolerance

**Eg**:- Despite his history of violence, the judge decided to grant him leniency due to his quick admission of guilt.

**6.Denounce:-** To criticize harshly and publicly  
{निन्दा करना}

**Mnemonics:-** de(negative) + announce

**Synonyms:-** Criticize, Castigate, Derogate

**Antonyms:-** Applaud, Praise, Compliment

**Eg:-** The dictator made a speech to denounce the actions of his enemies.



**7.Asset:-** A useful or valuable thing or quality {सम्पत्ति}

**Mnemonics:-** gold ka set loge to asset bhi banega

**Synonyms:-** Treasure, Credit, Resource

**Antonyms:-** Liability, Injury, Disadvantage

**Eg:-** Kim's foreign language skills are a huge asset to her job at the international banking center.

**8.Rejoinder:-** A clever or sharp response  
{उत्तर मिलने पर दिया हुआ उत्तर}

**Mnemonics:-** Re jhony lever mast rejoinder maara



**Synonyms:-** Rebuttal, Repartee, Retort

**Antonyms:-** Question, Request

**Eg:-** The comic is known for his ability to make a hilarious rejoinder with a deadpan expression on his face.



**9. Apathy:-** A feeling of having no interest in or enthusiasm about anything {उदासीनता}

**Mnemonics:-** a + pathos (emotions) /pati agar patni ko peete to Sympathy or patni Pati to peete to apathy.

**Synonyms:-** Indifference, Lethargy, Aloofness

**Antonyms:-** Concern, Sympathy, Passion

**Eg:-** My mother's love for my abusive father has been replaced by apathy.



**10. Beneficent:-** Generous in assistance to the poor  
{भलाई करनेवाला}

**Mnemonics:-** ben (good) + facto (to do)

**Synonyms:-** Altruistic, Benign, Charitable

**Antonyms:-** Misanthropic, Malicious, Maleficent

**Eg:-** My beneficent neighbor gives out meals to the poor every Sunday.

**11. Contempt:-** The feeling of intense dislike { घृणा }

**Mnemonics:-** con hai tu?

**Synonyms:-** Antipathy, Defiance, Derision

**Antonyms:-** Respect, Flattery, Praise

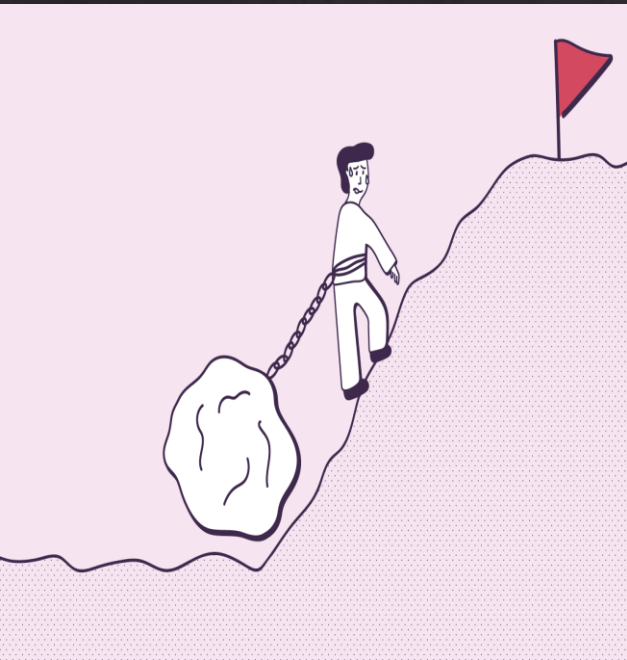
**Eg:-** The parents of the murder victim showed a great deal of contempt for their child's killer.



**12.Hindrance:-** A person or thing that obstructs {बाधा}

**Mnemonics:-** Road pe hindrance na aati to itna handna na padta

**Synonyms:-** Interference, Barrier, Obstacle

**Antonyms:-** Aid, Opening, Promotion

**Eg:-** The lack of money is the biggest hindrance we face in opening our cupcake shop.

**Antonyms:-** Construct, Rebuild, Mend

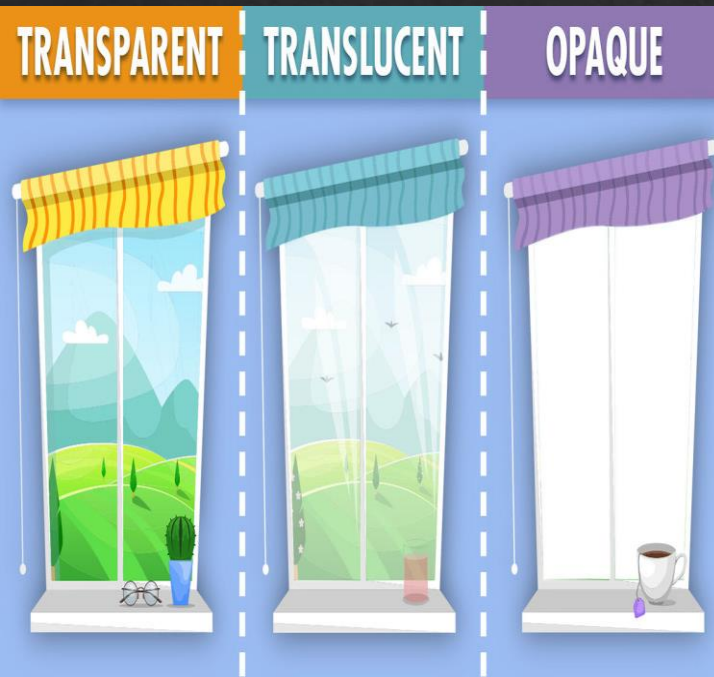
**Eg:-** Protesters chained themselves to the old church in an attempt to stop the construction crew from being able to demolish it.

**14.Transparent:-** Able to be seen through with clarity  
{ पारदर्शी }

**Mnemonics:-** trans + paar



**Synonyms:-** Clear, Permeable, Thin

**Antonyms:-** Cloudy, Block, Vague

**Eg:-** The principal scolded the student for wearing a transparent dress that revealed her entire body.



**15.Abhor:-** To regard with contempt or disgust  
{नफरत करना}

**Mnemonics:-** ab or nhi, I hate you

**Synonyms:-** Despise, Detest, Scorn

**Antonyms:-** Admire, Cherish, Adore

**Eg:-** I abhor the way some people have a picnic and leave their trash after leaving.

**16.Apex:-** The greatest or topmost position {शिखर}

**Mnemonics:-** apex post leke apni ex ko dikhaunga

**Synonyms:-** Pinnacle, Zenith, Meridian

**Antonyms:-** Nadir, Base, Bottom

**Eg:-** At the apex of our country sits the president of our nation.

**17.Bombastic:-** High sounding but with little meaning  
{बड़े बड़े शब्दों से भरा हुआ}

**Mnemonics:-** Words ka bomblast

**Synonyms:-** Grandiose, Pompous, Loudmouthed

**Antonyms:-** Humble, Quiet, Reserved

**Eg:-** Bombastic by nature, Daryl did not fit in with the quiet chess players.



## 18. Inquisitive:- Eager for knowledge {जानने का इच्छुक}

**Mnemonics:-** itne question puchta hai inquisitive hai

**Synonyms:-** Curious, Snooping, Inquiring

**Antonyms:-** Indifferent, Uninterested, Incurious

**Eg:-** When I was a teenage girl, my mother was very inquisitive about my boyfriends.

**19.Languid:-** very slow and relaxed {सुस्त}

**Mnemonics:-** jo langda me ma'am kare

**Synonyms:-** Lackadaisical, Lazy, Sluggish

**Antonyms:-** Energetic, Vivacious, Spirited

**Eg:-** After sleeping for hours, the cat moved leisurely in a languid motion.

**20.Malice:-** Desire to cause pain {कपट}

**Mnemonics:-** mal(bad) + wish

**Synonyms:-** Animosity, Animus, Bitterness

**Antonyms:-** Kindness, Morality, Sympathy

**Eg:-** John's malice towards his ex-wife led him to vandalize her car.



**21.Authentic:-** Which is not copied; Genuine  
{असली, वास्तविक}

**Synonyms:-** Accurate, Reliable, Legitimate

**Antonyms:-** Fake, Counterfeit, Invalid



**Eg:-** We went to an authentic Mexican restaurant for my birthday where they served cuisine like you would find in Mexico.

**22. Stingy:-** Lacking generosity or the capacity to spend money  
{कंजूस}

**Mnemonics:-** Stay in tangi

**Synonyms:-** Frugal, Thrifty, Miserly

**Antonyms:-** Extravagant, Generous, Spendthrift

**Eg.:-** Juliet's father was so stingy that when he took her out for her graduation dinner, he refused to pay despite the millions in his bank account.

**23.Ethical:-** Morally correct or acceptable {नैतिक}

**Synonyms:-** Humane, Moral, Righteous

**Antonyms:-** Corrupt, Immoral, Unethical



**Eg:-** Siya was known for being ethical in all of her dealings, which made her easy to trust.



**24.Profane:-** Characterized by vulgarity or cursing  
{अपवित्र}

**Mnemonics:-** professor ne profane comment karne wale  
student ko nikal dia

**Synonyms:-** Abusive, Vulgar, Coarse

**Antonyms:-** Polite, Sacred, Reverent

**Eg:-** Because the comic's jokes were profane and offensive to our religion, we left the show early.

**25.Absolve:-** To make someone free from guilt  
{मुक्त करना}

**Mnemonics:-** ab case solve ho gya hai usko absolve kar do

**Synonyms:-** Acquit, Exempt, Pardon

**Antonyms:-** Accuse, Blame, Convict

**Eg:-** The jury's innocent verdict appears to absolve the defendant of any guilt.

**26.Sluggish:-** Slow-moving and lacking in energy  
{धीमा, सुस्त}

**Mnemonics:-** slow due to luggage



**Synonyms:-** Stagnant, Lethargic, Draggy

**Antonyms:-** Lively, Moving, Energetic

**Eg:-** After staying up all night, the tired teenager was sluggish when morning arrived.



**27.Turbulent:-** Being in a wild or disordered state  
{उग्र, अशांत}

**Mnemonics:-** turbulence aane pe tubulent ho jate hai/  
ambulance bulani padegi wo jada turbulent hai

**Synonyms:-** Bumpy, Fierce, Stormy

**Antonyms:-** Moderate, Stable, Mild

**Eg:** When the protestors began to outnumber the police standing outside city hall, the environment became turbulent.

**28.D Decline:-** To move downwards {कम होना}

**Mnemonics:-** Decrease hoti hui line

**Synonyms:-** Deterioration, Weakening, Downturn

**Antonyms:-** Ascent, Upgrade, Betterment

**Eg:-** A crack in the water tower is causing the water level to decline.

**Eg:-** It only took seconds for the raging fire to fully engulf every room in the house.

**Mnemonics:-** freight ko flight se bhej sakte hain

**Antonyms:-** Unloading, Take away, Underspend

**Eg:-** The train is packed with freight that will be delivered to the depot this evening.

The action of gaining possession of something in exchange for payment  
{दोबारा मोल लेना}

**Mnemonics:-** Redeem



**Synonyms:-** Reparation, Compensation, Penance

**Antonyms:-** Downfall, Destruction, Ruin

**Eg:-** Phillip prays his confession will earn him the redemption of a reduced prison sentence.

## 32. Penchant:- A strong liking {झुकाव}

**Mnemonics:-** kuch logo ko panchayat karne ka penchat hota hai

**Synonyms:-** Affection, Affinity, Proneness

**Antonyms:-** Antipathy, Hatred, Indifference

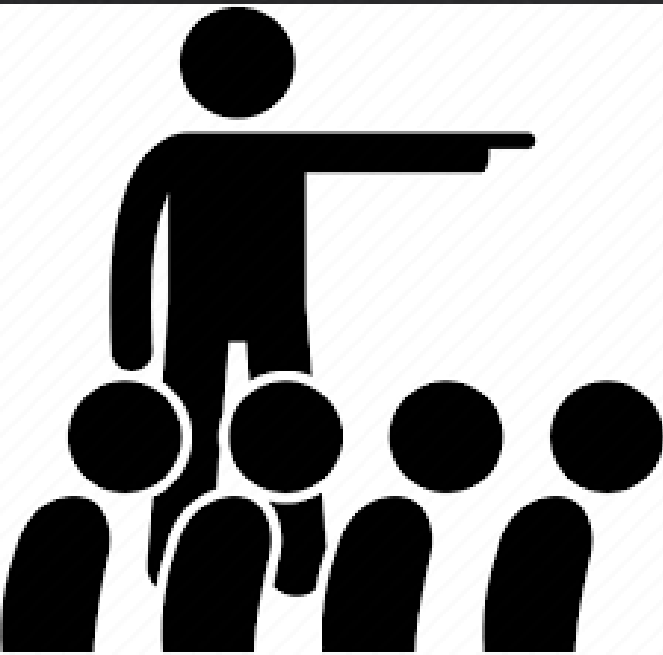
**Eg:-** Recently, Henry discovered he had a penchant for baking so he opened a café downtown.



**33.Adhere:-** conform to or follow rules exactly{पालन करना}

**Mnemonics:-** boss ke order ko adhere karo

**Synonyms:-** Comply, Heed, Abide by

**Antonyms:-** Ignore, Disobey, Overlook

**Eg:-** Restaurants that don't adhere to strict health codes can be shutdown.

**34.Site:-** A place where a specific event has occurred  
{ घटनास्थल }

**Synonyms:-** Scene, Spot, Locality

**Antonyms:-** Offshoot, Exterior, Outside

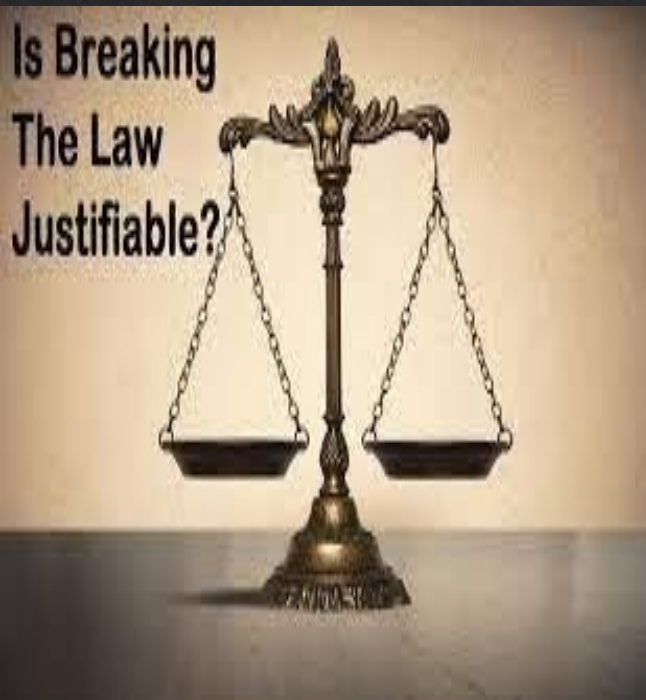

**Antonyms:-** Illegal, Unsuitable, Unlawful

**Eg:-** The only justifiable solution to the deadly epidemic of violence would be in a non-violent protest.

**36.Haphazard:-** Marked by great carelessness {बेढंग}

**Mnemonics:-** haphazard manner me drive karne se hazard ho sakta hai

**Eg:-** In his haphazard approach to nearly everything, Dale finds that his life is full of surprises.

**37.Dreadful:-** Extremely terrible or awful {बेकार}

**Mnemonics:-** dard + full

**Synonyms:-** Abominable, Appalling, Awful

**Antonyms:-** Beautiful, Comforting, Reputable

**Eg:-** With no cure for the dreadful disease that plagued his body, the man began to waste away.

**38.Access:-** The act of approaching or entering {पहुँच}

**Synonyms:-** Approach, Connection, Admittance

**Antonyms:-** Conclusion, Outlet, Egress



**Eg:-** She could no longer access her bank account because there had been too many suspicious purchases.



**39.Congestion:-** Excessive crowding {भरा हुआ होना}

**Mnemonics:-** traffic junction pe congestion

**Synonyms:-** Bottleneck, Traffic, Profusion

**Antonyms:-** Flood, Flow, Opening

**Eg:-** My doctor gave me antibiotics after my nasal congestion turn into a sinus infection.

{ भेद खोलना }

**Mnemonics:-** dis + close

**Synonyms:-** Reveal, Divulge, Expose

**Antonyms:-** Hide, Conceal, Repudiate

**Eg:-** The newspaper claimed it had the right to disclose the celebrity's arrest record since it is a part of public domain.

**41. Unequivocal:-** Clearly defined or formulated  
{साफ़-जाहिर}

**Mnemonics:-** un + equi + vocal

**Synonyms:-** Absolute, Apparent, Obvious

**Antonyms:-** Ambiguous, Doubtful, Dubious

**Eg:-** The laboratory experiment must be repeated because the results are not unequivocal.



**42.Spontaneous:-** said or done without having been planned  
{स्वाभाविक}

**Mnemonics:-** on the spot

Boys when girls reply in 3 days

Girls when boys don't reply in 2 seconds

**Synonyms:-** Unplanned, Instinctive, Impromptu

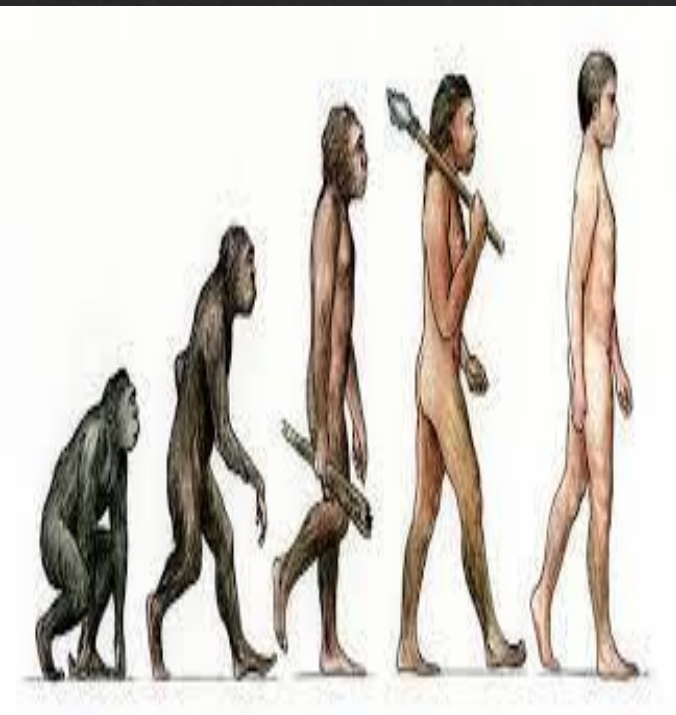
**Antonyms:-** Planned, Intended, Premeditated
