

**1.Faddish:-** Trending currently but not likely to be popular for a long period of time

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** jo bhut jaldi fade ho jayega.



**Synonyms:-** Trendy, Current, Modish

**Antonyms:-** Dull, Old, Out-moded

**Eg:-** The popularity of Ranu mondal was faddish.

## 2. Thrifty:- Careful with spending money

Mnemonics:- saving even fifty paise

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Frugal, Prudent, Stingy

**Antonyms:-** Spendthrift, Extravagant, Wasteful

**Eg:-** Because he was thrifty, the man decided to use coupons for shopping.

### 3. Depressed:- Feeling extremely sad

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Gloomy, Morose, Unhappy

**Antonyms:-** Cheerful, Glad, Optimistic

**Eg:-** The depressed mother decided to talk to a counselor about her feelings of unhappiness.



## 4.Craven:- A coward

Mnemonics:- kayar one to one nhi ladte

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Timid, Chicken-hearted, Fearful

**Antonyms:-** Courageous, Bold, Heroic

**Eg:-** My husband James proves he is not craven every time he runs into a burning building to save a stranger.



## 5. Buddy:- A friend

➤ **Synonyms:-** Associate, Companion, Comrade

Aman Sir English

➤ **Antonyms:-** Enemy, Foe, Stranger



**Eg:-** The lonely preschooler needed a buddy to play with at recess, but none of the other children wanted to be her friend.

## 6. Jeune:- Lacking interest or significance

Mnemonics:- boring jijune party jijune kar di



**Synonyms:-** Immature, Arid, Banal

**Antonyms:-** Significant, Mature, Plentiful

**Eg:-** The man's 2006 computer is jeune when compared to my 2015 model for scientific purpose.



## 7.Famine:- A severe food shortage

Mnemonics:- family kaise survive karegi femine me

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Drought, Misery, Starvation

**Antonyms:-** Abundance, Plenty, Ample

**Eg:-** To help ease the suffering caused by famine, the United Nations is sending food to the African nation.

**8.Wallow:-** to roll about or lie in water, snow, mud, dust, or the like, as for refreshment:

Mnemonics:- Buffalo wallow in mud



**Eg:-** I spent an hour wallowing in the bath.



## 9. Wallow:- To indulge in one's emotions

Mnemonics:- vele baithe purani yaade wallow karte hain

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Pamper, Immerse,

**Antonyms:-** Hate, Dislike, Ignore

**Eg:-** Ever since April lost her job, she has done nothing but wallow in self-pity.

## 10. Concealment:- The action of hiding something

Mnemonics:- concealer lga ke pimple ko karte seal

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Hiding, Secrecy, Camouflage

**Antonyms:-** Disclosure, Divulgence, Exposition

**Eg.:-** The felon was charged with concealment of a dead body after he helped hide the murder victim's corpse in the woods.



## 11. Bogus:- Having a misleading appearance

Mnemonics:- farji ka focus

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Forged, Fake, False

**Antonyms:-** Actual, Authentic, Genuine

**Eg.:-** The jewelry store owner was arrested for selling bogus diamonds as genuine gems.



## 12.Soar:- To rise high

Mnemonics :- so + air / upar ki aur

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Ascend, Escalate, Mount

**Antonyms:-** Decline, Decrease, Descend

**Eg.:-** Gas prices always seem to soar in the summer when families are getting ready to travel.

**13.Restorative:-** Capable of making an individual feel well

**Mnemonics:-** apne apko fir se restore karna / rest karke waps active

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Healing, Tonic, Curable

**Antonyms:-** Neglectful, Harmful, Hurtful

**Eg.:-** The doctor will tell you that most medications don't have the restorative power of a good night's sleep.

**14.Sensation:-** A feeling picked up by one of the five senses

**Mnemonics:-** sensitivity in teeth se hua dard ka sensation

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Emotion, Sentiment, Sensitivity

**Antonyms:-** Antipathy, Emotionless

**Eg.:-** The burning sensation in the man's eye only seemed to intensify as he flushed it with water.



**15.Decimate:-** To destroy or greatly decrease in size or number

**Mnemonics:-** desi admi ke mate se panga lia to wo decimate kar dega Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Annihilate, Exterminate, Slaughter

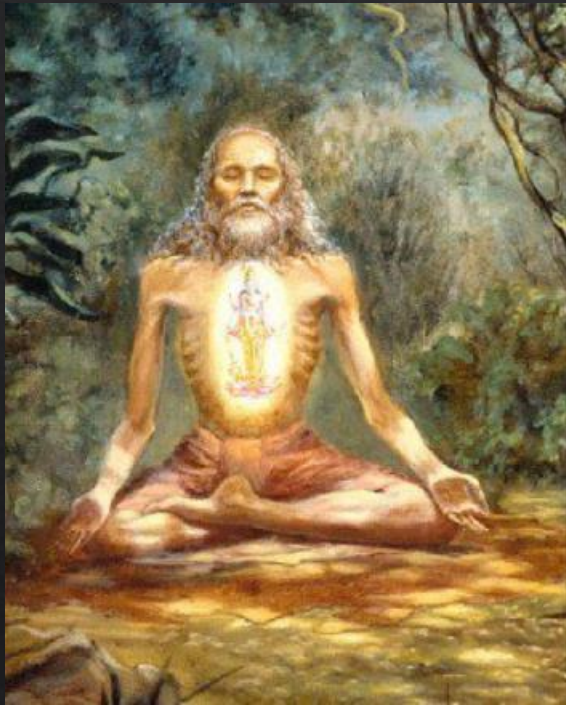
**Antonyms:-** Bear, Build, Construct

**Eg.:-** It is likely the category five hurricane will decimate the small beach town.

**16.Oblate:-** A person dedicated to religious work or the religious life

**Mnemonics:-** ab bas bhajan ki latt hai

**Antonyms:-** Sociable, Affable, Approachable

**Eg.:-** Sadhguru is an oblate person who hardly leaves monastery in his daily life.

**17.Enigmatic:-** Full of mystery and difficult to understand

**Mnemonics:-** arithmetic mere liye enigmatic hai

**19.Accessory:-** a supplementary component that improves capability

**Mnemonics:-** extra items

**Synonyms:-** Component, Supplement, Appliance

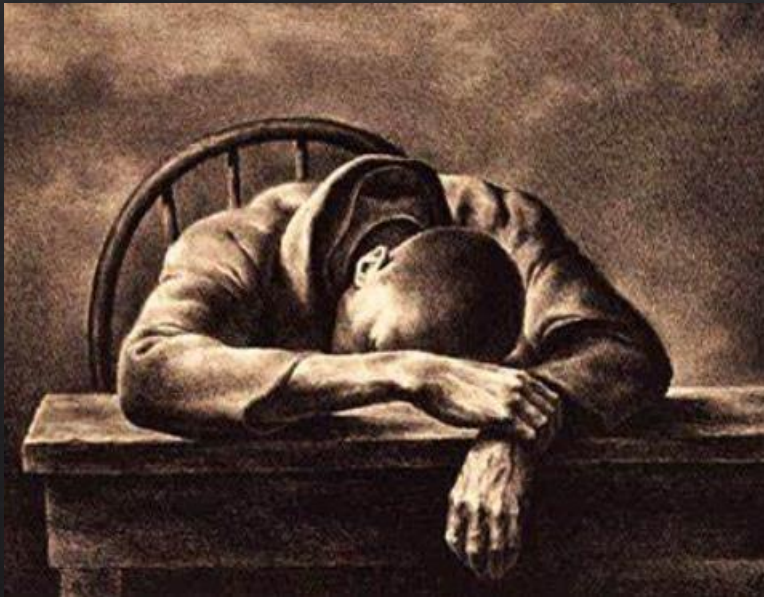
**Antonyms:-** Subtraction, Detriment, Lessening

**20.Despondent:-** very sad and without hope

**Mnemonics:-** disappointed

**Antonyms:-** Cheerful, Elated, Hopeful

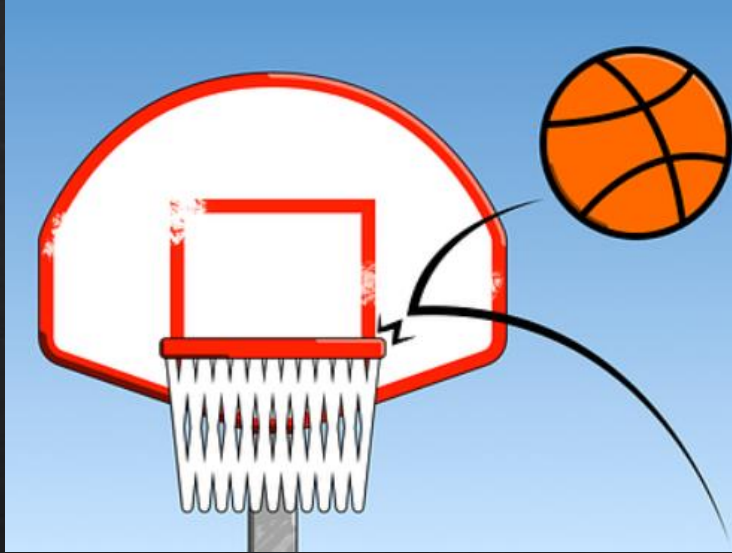
**Eg:-** Marilyn was despondent after her husband of fifty years died.



## 21. Amiss:- away from the correct

Mnemonics:- a missed shot

**Synonyms:-** Awry, Improper, Crooked

**Antonyms:-** Proper, Suitable, Well

**Eg:-** I could see by the look on their faces that something was amiss.

## 22.Nadir:- the lowest point of anything

Mnemonics:- nadi hamesha nadir point ki taraf behti hai

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Base, Bottom, Floor

**Antonyms:-** Top, Zenith, Apex

**Eg:-** This actor has reached his nadir and not getting any movies.



## 23. Knack:- A natural ability

**Synonyms:-** Skill, Aptitude, Ingenuity

**Antonyms:-** Ignorance, Incompetence, Inability

**Eg:-** The woman's knack for decorating earned her a job offer with a well-known company.



## 24. Anomalous:- Different from the normal

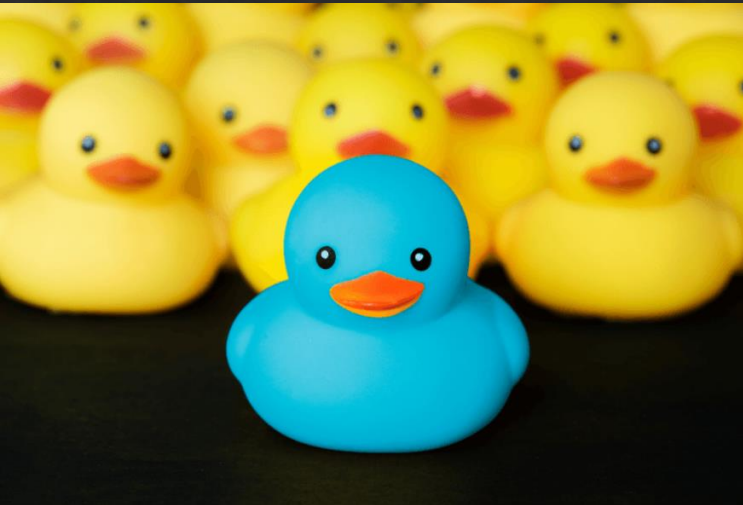
Mnemonics:- not normal

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Peculiar, Abnormal, Atypical

**Antonyms:-** Usual, Ordinary, Conforming

**Eg:-** My sister was pretending to act normal after breaking up with her boyfriend, but her anomalous activities that strayed from the routine proved she was just faking it.



**25.Celestial:-** associated with a spiritual paradise

**Mnemonics:-** space related / saurmandal

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Angelic, Heavenly, Ethereal

**Antonyms:-** Earthly, Hellish, Mortal

**Eg:-** she is an atheist so she doesn't believe in celestial life.

**26.Fiend:-** An extremely evil person

**Mnemonics:-** a fiend can never be friend

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Barbarian, Brute, Demon

**Antonyms:-** Angel, Aiding, Decent

**Eg:-** The fiend stole money from the little boys who were raising money for the Cancer Society.



**27.Delinquency:-** failure to pay a debt that is owed

**Synonyms:-** Default, Lapse, Dereliction

Aman Sir English

**Antonyms:-** Fulfilment, Accomplishment, Solvency

**Mnemonics:-** Daily question karne aata hai koi na koi tere baare me.



**Eg:-** Rising delinquency rates on credit cards means that more and more people are unable to pay their bills.

**28.Relentless:-** Never-ceasing; Unyielding

**Synonyms:-** Persistent, Determined, Tenacious

Aman Sir English

**Antonyms:-** Ending, Surrendering, Intermittent

**Mnemonics:-** rest less work more



**Eg:-** During the battle, the relentless soldier continued to fight despite the bullet in his shoulder.

**29.Vain:-** without success

**Mnemonics:-** van pe lgaye paise vain ho gye

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Frivolous, Fruitless, Trivial

**Antonyms:-** Significant, Modest, Possible

**Eg:-** After Vera failed the class, it was obvious her long hours of studying were in vain.



## 30. **Forthright**:- Direct and honest

**Mnemonics**:- apna right mangne ke liye forthright hona chahiye

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms**:- Blunt, Candid, Outspoken

**Antonyms**:- Tactful, Devious, Secret

**Eg**:- If you are not forthright when answering the detective's questions, you might end up in jail.

## **31.Objurgation:-** a severe reprimand or criticism

**Mnemonics:-** ab jug todne pe objurgation hi milega

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Admonition, Censure, Snub

**Antonyms:-** Sanction, Approval, Exoneration

**Eg:-** The teenager faced objurgation from his parents when he returned home after midnight.

**32.Obfuscate:-** To deliberately make something confusing

**Mnemonics:-** students ko fasane ke liye teacher ne question ko obfuscate kiya

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Baffle, Befuddle, Complicate

**Antonyms:-** Clarify, Enlighten, Explain

**Eg:-** The loan contract was filled with legal words meant to obfuscate trusting borrowers.

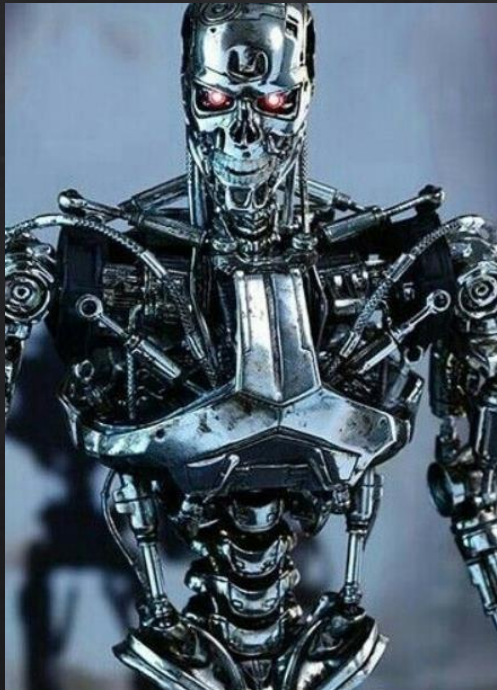




### **33. Robust:-** strong and healthy

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Potent, Hefty, Tough

**Antonyms:-** Fragile, Wobbly, Soft

**Eg:-** In order to be a fireman, one needs to be robust because fighting fires is a very difficult job.

### 34. Pellucid:- very well-defined in meaning

Mnemonics:- purely + lucid

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Limpid, Transparent, Explicit

**Antonyms:-** Opaque, Vague, Blurred

**Eg:-** The contract was pellucid and left no confusion about each party's responsibilities.

## 35.Famish:- to make someone extremely hungry

Mnemonics:- family ka pet bharne ke liye khud ko famish karti hai

**Synonyms:-** Abstain, Diet, Starve

**Antonyms:-** Indulge, Glut, Gorge

**Eg.:-** Repeated crop failures almost famished the state's population



## **36.Reprove:-** To strongly disapprove

**Synonyms:-** Reprimand, Admonish, Rebuke

**Antonyms:-** Praise, Commend, Please

**Eg.:-** My father will more than likely reprove of my new boyfriend and chase him away like he has done all the others.

## 37. Sinister:- wicked or evil

Mnemonics:- sin karne wala sinister

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Nasty, Menacing, Ominous

**Antonyms:-** Auspicious, Benevolent, Kind

**Eg.:-** A sinister-looking man sat in the corner of the room.

## 38. Incongruous:- out of place

Mnemonics:- Bjp aur congress incongruous hai

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Bizzare, Absurd, Incoherent

**Antonyms:-** Compatible, Congruous, Uniform

**Eg.:-** Considering the ruthless actions of his past, Oliver's unexpected friendly attitude is awfully incongruous.



**39. Annex:-** an addition to something (generally a building)

**Mnemonics:-** an extra building or part

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Addendum, Appendix, Affix

**Antonyms:-** Base, Lessening, Subtraction

**Eg.:-** Once the annex is built, we will move the Asian artifacts to that section of the building.

## 40.Elucidate:- to make clear or easy to understand

Mnemonics:- luci ko date pe le jane ka pura plan elucidate kiya dost ne Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Explain, Exemplify, Decode

**Antonyms:-** Complicate, Obscure, Conceal

**Eg.:-** To make life easy for my students, I go out of my way to elucidate the complex problems before each test.

**41.Sorcery:-** the utilization of magical abilities acquired from evil souls

**Mnemonics:-** naukri pane ke bhi sorcery karne lage hain kuch log

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Witchcraft, Conjuring,

## 42.Frighten:- to scare or make afraid

Mnemonics:- flight karti hai usko frighten

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Agitate, Astound, Daunt

**Antonyms:-** Delight, Embolden, Soothe.

**Eg.:-** He got frightened when he got to know that he had to travel by air.
