

1. Renegade:- Someone who rebels and becomes an betrayer

Mnemonics:- jo apni hi country mein grenade fek de voh renegade



Synonyms:- Reactionary, Apostate, Disloyal

Antonyms:- Obedient, Passive, Submissive

Eg:- The renegade soldiers decided to leave the base and go back home to their families.

2.Adipose:- Composed of animal fat

Mnemonics:- Adi itna mota ho gya ki shi se pose nhi de paata



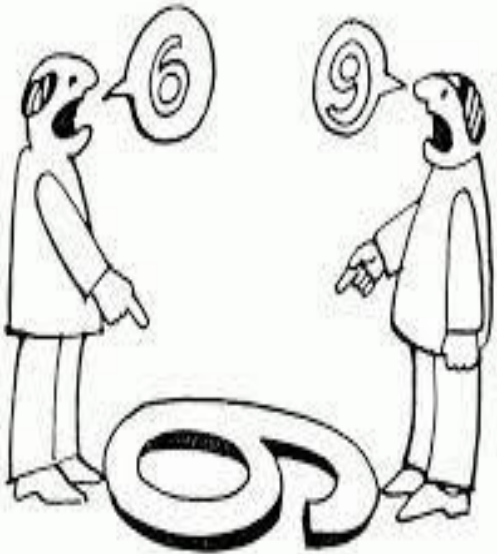
Synonyms:- Greasy, Oily

Antonyms:- Stringy, Thin, Ectomorphic

Eg:- When people want to lose weight, they typically want to lose adipose tissue, commonly known as fat.

3.Perceive:- To become aware of through the senses

Mnemonics:- how you see or receive and information



Synonyms:- Discern, Grasp, Regard

Antonyms:- Overlook, Dodge, Avoid

Eg:- Sometimes I am so concerned about how others perceive me that I do not always listen to my own voice.

4.Dazzling:- Very stunning and amazing

Mnemonics:- darjling k views dazzling hain



Synonyms:- Flashy, Glittering, Beaming

Antonyms:- Ordinary, Dull, Usual

Eg:- Everyone in the church turned in awe when they saw the dazzling bride in her exquisite gown walk down the aisle.

5.Rabble:- A disorderly crowd

Mnemonics:- rebellion ke time logon ki rabble



Synonyms:- Gathering, Mass, Mob

Antonyms:- Elite, Aristocracy

Eg:- Chanting ‘hell no, we won’t go,’ the rabble continued their disorderly march through the city streets.

6.Privilege:- An advantage or benefit given to certain individuals

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- Village mein nhi milta privilege



Synonyms:- Advantage, Prerogative, Liberty

Antonyms:- Detriment, Restriction, Misfortune

Eg:- As a senior account executive, I now have the privilege of access to the executive lounge.

7. Propitious:- Presenting favorable circumstances

Mnemonics:- Usko propose karne ka propitious time hai ye

Synonyms:- Opportune, Auspicious, Prosperous

Antonyms:- Unlucky, Unfriendly, Cold

Eg:- After my parents turned their attention to my younger sister, I knew it was a propitious time for me to sneak out of the room.



8.Lucid:- Easily understandable

Mnemonics:- this liquid is lucid



Synonyms:- Coherent, Crystalline, Limpid

Antonyms:- Confused, Clouded, Gloomy

Eg:- The directions for assembling the complex table were not very lucid.

9.Acumen:- Experience or expertise in something {चतुरता, कुशाग्रता} Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- accurate men for some work



Synonyms:- Acuity, Shrewdness, Sagacity

Antonyms:- Stupidity, Ineptness, Obtuseness

Eg:- John's business acumen, along with his computer skills, made him an asset to the software company.

10. Prudent:- Careful and sensible; marked by sound judgment

Mnemonics:- President kalam was pudent



Synonyms:- Discreet, Cautious, Vigilant

Antonyms:- Imprudent, Foolish, Nonsensical

Eg:- Since so many car accidents have happened at that intersection, it would be prudent for the city to put a stop sign in the area.

11. Emigration:- The act of relocating to another region or nation

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Homesteading, Reestablishment, Uprooting

Antonyms:- Immigration, Arrival, Entrance



Eg:- Because of the high rate of emigration, our country's population is decreasing.

12.Precedence:- The notion of being more important than something else

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- By default president k pas hota hai precedence

Synonyms:- Anteposition, Earliness, Priority

Antonyms:- Inferiority, Lowest, Subservience

Eg:- If you are the first person in line for something, you have precedence over all of the people behind you, unless there is an emergency.

13.Ridicule:- Mocking or humiliating words or behavior

Mnemonics:- ride karta tha cycle pe isliye dost karte the ridicule



Synonyms:- Mockery, Satire, Banter

Antonyms:- Admiration, Flattery, Praise

Eg:- After spilling coffee on his shirt, he knew his co-workers would ridicule him.

14.Evanescent:- Lasting only for a very short time

Mnemonics:- saste scent evanescent hote hain



Synonyms:- Fleeting, Momentary, Brief

Antonyms:- Permanent, Everlasting, Unlimited

Eg:- The lightning was evanescent and disappeared just as quickly as it appeared.

15. Gracious:- Courteous and kind person

Mnemonics:- grace / great



Synonyms:- Amiable, Affable, Congenial

Antonyms:- Aloof, Indifferent, Surly

Eg:- While the manager did not hire me, he was gracious enough to tell me about open positions at other stores.

16.Abide:- Put up with something or somebody unpleasant

Mnemonics:- a + {bide} = bride = tolerate



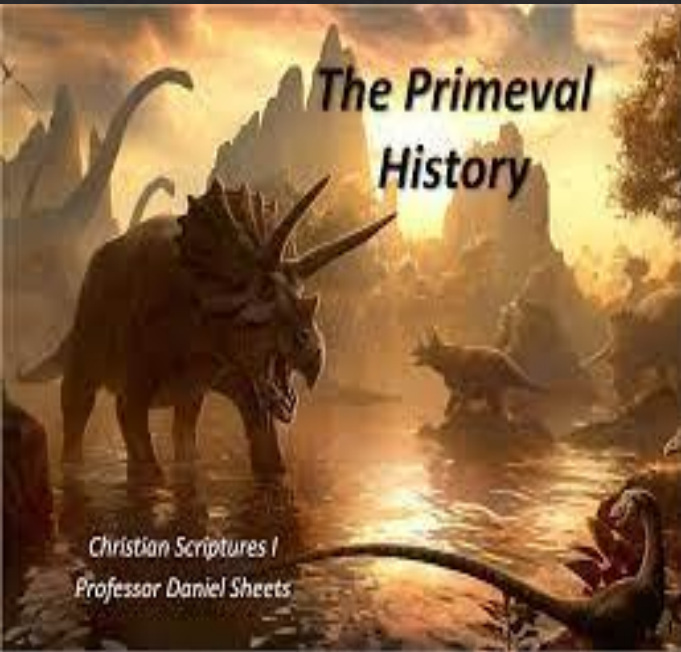
Synonyms:- Endure, Tolerate, Suffer

Antonyms:- Repudiate, Refuse, Contradict

Eg:- Although my daughter hates the school dress code, she knows she must abide by it.

17.Primeval:- In an earliest or original stage; Extremely old

Mnemonics:- primary level / before medieval



Synonyms:- Primitive, Pristine, Primal

Antonyms:- Modern, Latest, Recent

Eg.:- The archaeologist found several primeval dinosaur bones in the canyon.

18.Solitude:- State of being alone

Mnemonics:- attitude + solo



Synonyms:- Isolation, Seclusion, Confinement

Antonyms:- Companionship, Togetherness, Friendship

Eg:- After attacking his fellow inmate, the prisoner was put in solitude to keep him from harming anyone else.

19.Blitz:- A sudden or intensive effort, often referring to a military attack

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- blasts



Synonyms:- Shelling, Assault, Bombardment

Antonyms:- Letup, Ceasefire, Obtuse

Eg:- The blitz bombing caught Pakistani military by surprise, allowing Indian army to win the war.

20.Defile:- To spoil or contaminate

Mnemonics:- waps de file tune to isko defile kar dia



Synonyms:- Debase, Vitiate, Adulterate

Antonyms:- Elevate, Praise, Upgrade

Eg:- Mrs. Underwood told her Sunday School students that they should never defile a church or other holy place with vulgar behavior and language.

21.Savory:- Pleasing to the sense of taste or smell

Mnemonics:- save+poori is pleasant to taste

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Delectable, Luscious, Aromatic

Antonyms:- Bland, Dull, Stinking

Eg:- The savory potato salad was a huge hit at the church picnic organized by warner.

22. Woeful:- Affected by or full of grief

Mnemonics:- roya full because he is woeful



Synonyms:- Pitiful, Pathetic, Abjectness

Antonyms:- Bulge, Cheerful, Pleasure

Eg:- She had a woeful face when I met her.

23. Terse:- A very short statement or remark

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- aise terse reply karega to terse baar nhi karungi



Synonyms:- Concise, Brief, Crisp

Antonyms:- Wordy, Verbose, Lengthy

Eg:- Although Phillip is known for making long speeches, his last speech was incredibly terse.

24.Intrinsic:- Belonging to a thing by its very nature

Mnemonics:- in (andar) hai tere

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Elemental, Hereditary, Underlying

Antonyms:- Extrinsic, Learned, Acquired

Eg:- To learn how the planet rotates, all one has to do is to look at the intrinsic laws of nature.

25. Haughty:- Having or showing arrogant superiority

Mnemonics:- horse pe baith ke hat lga ke jada haughty ban rha hai

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Egotistic, Conceited, Scornful

Antonyms:- Humble, Modest, Timid

Eg:- When the haughty CEO ignored the stockholders at the annual conference, the board of directors gave him a stern lecture.

26.Cumbersome:- Difficult to manage

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- moti kamar patli krna cumbersome hota hai



Synonyms:- Bulky, Burdensome, Ponderous

Antonyms:- Convenient, Easy, Graceful

Eg:- Because the cumbersome package weighed over three hundred pounds, it took two men to move it.

27.Vice:- Immoral or wicked behaviour

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- wise men vice nhi karte



Synonyms:- Cernality, Depravity, Lechery

Antonyms:- Chastity, Decency, Virtue

Eg:- I begged my husband to quit his vice of gambling .

28. Knave:- A dishonest individual

Mnemonics:- hero ney use knave se kia save



Synonyms:- Reprobate, Fraud, Scamp

Antonyms:- Loyal, Benefactor, Samaritan

Eg:- The knave volunteered to clean the church so he could have access to the petty cash box.

29. Aplomb:- Great coolness and composure under strain

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- Bomb phatne pe bhi indian army aplomb dikhati hai



Synonyms:- Sang-froid, Assuredness, Poise

Antonyms:- Fear, Gaucheness, Stress

Eg:- Because the negotiator handled the hostage situation with aplomb, the kidnapper released everyone without harm.

30.Facile:- Performing adroitly and without effort

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- facial with fair & lovely is facile



Synonyms:- Adroit, Glib, Effortless

Antonyms:- Arduous, Profound, Confusing

Eg:- While the adults found the video game complicated, the teenagers thought it was facile and easily played.

31.Rendezvous:- A meeting planned at a certain time and place

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- rainy day me zoo me gyi lover se rendezvous karne



Synonyms:- Tryst, Assignment, Meeting

Antonyms:- Non-involvement, Non-engagement, Disassembly

Eg:- During the war, the spies would often exchange information during a rendezvous in the church.

32.Flagitious:- To act in an evil way

Mnemonics:- Apne flag ko upar karne k lie flagitious behave karta tha



Synonyms:- Atrocious, Flagrant, Heinous

Antonyms:- Innocent, Friendly, Admirable

Eg:- Setting forest fires is a flagitious act because it endangers wildlife and destroys local homes.

33.Dissipate:- Disappear or cause to disappear

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- healthy hone k lie pet ko dissipate krna padta hai



Synonyms:- Deplete, Trifle away, Blow

Antonyms:- Hoard, Accumulate, Gather

Eg:- According to meteorologists, the storm will dissipate after a few hours and make way for the sunshine.

34.Sycophant:- A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal advantage

Mnemonics:- ek psycho fan ki tarah chaploosi karne wala



Synonyms:- Adulator, Bootlicker, Fawner

Antonyms:- Nonconformist, Independent, Leader

Eg:- The rapper's assistant was a sycophant who offered his boss compliments at every turn.

35. Gregarious:- Fond of the company of others

Aman Sir English

Root word:- greg = group



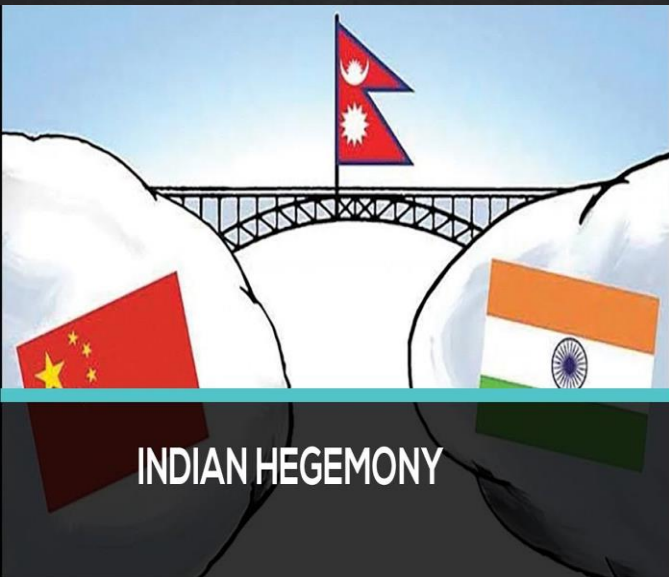
Synonyms:- Sociable, Affable, Cordial

Antonyms:- Unfriendly, Hostile, Introverted

Eg:- She is gregarious so she has a lot of friends.

36.Hegemony:- The dominance or leadership of one social group or nation over others

Mnemonics:- powerful country money aid deke choti country pe hegemony chalte hain



Synonyms:- Authority, Command, Predominance

Antonyms:- Powerlessness, Impotence, Weakness

Eg:- India and China spend a lot to maintain their hegemony over his Nepal.

37.Imbue:- To cause to be strongly influenced by a quality or emotion

Mnemonics:- jaise imbue imbibe ho jati waise hi feeling etc imbibe karna

Synonyms:- Diffuse, Soak, Infuse

Antonyms:- Drain, Take-out, Eradicate

Eg:- After the terrorist bombings, the government placed several of the country's flags at the site of the ruins to imbue patriotism.



38.Nimble:- Quick in action

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- gamble karne walo pe raid padi to sab nimble karke nikal gye

Synonyms:- Agile, Quick, Spry

Antonyms:- Lazy, Languid, Incompetent

Eg:- The overweight police officer could not catch the nimble suspect.

39.Compunction:- Anxiety arising from awareness of guilt

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- come punch me main bhut galat kaam kia hai



Synonyms:- Attrition, Conscience, Contrition

Antonyms:- Disdain, Defiance, Meanness

Eg:- The serial killer showed no compunction when his guilty verdict was announced.

40.Clairvoyant:- Able to see beyond the range of ordinary Observation like ability to see future etc

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- clear vision of future



Synonyms:- Precognitive, Visionary, Far-sighted

Antonyms:- Infamy, Opprobrium, Disapproval

Eg:- The psychic's clairvoyant abilities allowed her to see into the future.
